Mr. Randall presented amendments to the fee schedule for the Tooele City Library. The changes include raising the interlibrary loan cost from \$3 to \$5, the attorney letter fee for patron not returning, damaging, broken, or destroyed items at \$30, and a fax service of \$0.50 per page.

Mr. Hansen presented an agreement with Ensign Engineering for design of the 2400 North Roadway and the Middle Canyon Channel. The City was able to secure some additional funds for this project which will be turned over to Tooele School District. The cost is \$39,850 from the County funds.

Mr. Stewart presented an amendment to the Tooele City Fee Schedule in regards to public infrastructure district. When the policy for infrastructure improvements was created, a fee was not included. The fee of \$1000 for the initial review of the letter of intent and a second fee of \$1000 when the governing documents are submitted will be added to the fee schedule.

Mr. Stewart presented a payment of a fee in lieu of water rights conveyance for Granite Credit Union. The company is planning to purchase property near Home Depot. They are requesting .75-acre feet of water. Staff has calculated it for .35-acre feet of water, but would like to provide some space for the business if needed. Granite Credit Union will provide five full time jobs.

Mr. Cook presented an agreement with Creative Signs and Graphics for construction of a new digital sign at Veteran's Memorial Park. The old sign has become unusable. This contract is in the amount of \$44,753.49.

14. <u>Resolution 2024-16 A Resolution of the Tooele City Council Approving an Agreement</u> with SKM for SCADA System Upgrades at Various City Wells

Presented by Jamie Grandpre, Public Works Director

Mr. Grandpre presented an agreement with SKM for SCADA system upgrades at various city wells. The contract is in the amount of \$83,144 from the water department budget.

The City Council asked the following questions: Cell modems were installed a few years ago. Are those not reliable? When do staff anticipate when it will be done? Is this system tied into Tooele County response?

Mr. Grandpre addressed the Council's questions. The system is all radio based. Staff would like to get it switched over to fiber in time. With continued construction, the radios have been taken over. Staff anticipates this project will be done by the end of next year. Their communication tower is now at the police station. This system is a stand-alone system.
