



Money Magazine said employment was an important factor. "Since its inception in 1850, Tooele had always been a mining area - but now scientific and technical fields are blossoming too. The county—one of the first in Utah—is near full employment and wages are growing at an above-average rate. Helping out is a plan by Pittsburgh-based Alle-

### **Celebrating 5 Years of Service to Tooele's Youth!**

Relatively new to the area, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Salt Lake is celebrating our fifth year of providing crucial services to over 700 youth in Tooele County. Still, many schoolaged kids living in Tooele leave school everyday with no place to go, no plan for how they'll use their leisure time, and no supervision. What happens during this time is staggering. Teens



who are unsupervised during after school hours are 37% more likely to become teen parents. On school days, the hours from 3-6 p.m. are the peak hours for youth to commit crimes, become victims of crime, or smoke or drink alcohol. The single most likely hour of the day for a juvenile to commit an assault with a weapon is between 3 and 4 p.m.

- \$25 provides three kids with daily access to high-quality youth development programs.
- \$77 will keep one teen off the streets for an entire summer.
- \$150 provides a safe place for one child to go after school for 6 months.
- \$300 will give one child a year of interaction with positive role models who care about them and want them to become successful in their lives.
