JANUARY BROUGHT RECORD LOW TEMPERATURES—AND SOME FREEZING PIPES!

Winter brings a beautiful change in our landscape, as shown in the picture to the left, but this year it also brought record low temperatures. January was so cold that some people experienced frozen pipes. Although February is typically a warmer month, here is some information that may be helpful if we have more freezing temperatures:

Pipes that freeze most frequently are those that are exposed to severe cold, like outdoor hose bibs, swimming pool supply lines, water sprinkler lines and water supply pipes in unheated interior areas like basements and crawl spaces, attics, garages or kitchen cabinets. Also, pipes that run against exterior walls that have little or no insulation are also subject to freezing. Surprisingly, ice forming in a pipe doesn't typically cause a break where the ice blockage occurs. It's the radial expansion of ice against the wall of the pipe that causes the break

- Letting a faucet drip during extreme cold weather can prevent a pipe from bursting.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to
 allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move
 any harmful cleaners
 and household chemicals
 up out of the reach of
 children.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night.
- Vulnerable pipes should be fitted with insulation sleeves or wrapping, the more insulation the bet-

- ter
- Cracks and holes in outside walls and foundations near water pipes should be sealed with caulking to keep cold wind away from the pipes.
- If you turn on a faucet and only a trickle of water comes out, call Tooele City at 843-2150. Tooele City will send out a service technician. If you have a problem with frozen pipes and it is after regular business hours, please call dispatch at 911. Or, you can call a licensed plumber.
