# 2007 Utility and Roadway Improvements by Paul Hansen, City Engineer

As part of an ongoing utility and roadway maintenance and upgrade program, Tooele City Public Works is about to commence a series of water line, sewer line and roadway improvements. In general, the work as proposed will include approximately:

- 4,400 feet of new culinary waterline to replace existing undersized lines;
- 260 residential water service laterals will be replaced;
- 20 new fire hydrants will be installed for increased fire protection:
- ♦ 1,350 feet of new sanitary sewer line to replace existing lines;
- 70 new accessible ADA corner ramps will be installed;
- 2,400,000 square feet of roadway will have a slurry seal applied to them; and
- 500,000 square feet of roadway will be overlain with new asphalt.

Funding for these projects will be a combination of City water and sewer revenue funds and Road "C" funds. The work shown above is scheduled to be completed on the following roads throughout late spring and summer.

Some streets will have major utility work consisting of mainline replacement of water lines, replacement of sewer lines, or both. However, all of the streets shown in the table on Page 2, will include replacements of water services, which have not already been replaced within the past few years. Upon completion of the work, all of the streets will also be reconstructed with a heavy asphalt overlay, which is intended to provide many years of extended roadway life. Accessible corner ramps will also be constructed to comply with Federal Guidelines.

Unfortunately, the replacement of main water lines and sewer lines requires significant effort and time, which may cause some inconvenience to residents. The city will work with the contractors who will be performing the work as well as affected residents to minimize this impact wherever possible. We apologize in advance for the inconvenience that this work may cause, and ask the cooperation and patience of all residents as we make these necessary system upgrades.

In addition to the above major work items, the city will also be providing a slurry seal treatment to several existing residential roadways in town as part of its ongoing pavement management program. This slurry seal work will require some short term closure of streets (Less than 1 day in duration) and will occur in several areas throughout the City. Residents who are likely to be impacted by this work will be notified in advance, and notices will be published in the paper announcing street closures in advance of the work.

Tooele City Police Department will be participating in the statewide "Click it or Ticket Campaign" from May 21 – June 3. The campaign is designed to encourage motorists to wear their seatbelts. Additional officers will be out looking for seatbelt violations and issuing citations. There will be "zero tolerance" for such violations. Remember all occupants of a vehicle must wear a seatbelt. For motorists age 18 and below the offense can be the primary violation. For motorists 19 years and above the offense is secondary, requiring another traffic violation for the stop. Any passengers in the vehicle age 16 and above can receive their own citation for the violation. It is the driver's duty to see that passengers 15 and below are properly restrained. Children younger than five must be properly restrained in a child restraint.
