

The Utah Highway Safety Office is asking for your help—as individuals, as well as a community. Aggressive and inattentive driving problems which contribute to crashes—have made their way into communities all across Utah. If we can all make an extra effort to drive with care and courtesy, the number of driver error and aggressive related crashes will be reduced. The following are some tips for a more courteous and friendly driving experience:

- Maintain a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you.
- Use your signal to turn, change lanes or merge.
- Make sure you can change lanes without cutting off another driver.
- If another driver wants to pass, let them.
- Maintain an even pace while driving—don't be a jack rabbit.
- Driving is not a game. Leave

- your competitive instincts in the game.
- Use your horn sparingly.
- Respect pedestrians' right of
- Adjust your attitude, let other drivers' actions go.
- Be patient while driving.
- Plan your trips ahead to avoid congéstion.
- Avoid multi-tasking. For example texting, cell phone use, shaving, putting on makeup reading etc.
- Avoid using threatening or obscene hand gestures.

# HEART GALLERY OTAH








A picture is worth a thousand words! And that's what the presenters of Heart Gallery Utah are hoping. The Gallery opens in Tooele City on August 1st at the Tooele City Hall. The unique exhibit will combine the talents of many professional Utah photographers to reflect the personalities of foster children waiting to be adopted. In photo after photo, the unique light in each child—a light sometimes buried after years of neglect, abuse, and low self-esteem has been captured through each photographer's art and talent.

What is even more unique about the Heart Gallery Utah exhibit is that the pictures showing the children and teens at their best were taken and donated by the photographers. The hope is that the photographs will replace the typical mug shot in each child's file and capture the spirit and personality of each and result in more of the children being adopted.

Portraits of 30 children will be on display. The Adoption Exchange, an adoption recruitment agency for the state's Division of Child and Family Services, is presenting the exhibit through donations of time, services, and money from many sources including local photographers, framers, law firms, banks, and businesses. The Tooele City Hall has donated space for the exhibit which will be on display there through September 2008. Thereafter, the exhibit will travel to other venues throughout the state.

Nearly 130,000 children in the U.S. public-welfare system are waiting for an adoptive family. Most are eight years or older. Some of the most difficult children to place are those of minority backgrounds or in sibling groups. And, sadly, about 21,000 children "age out" of the system every year without ever being adopted. Business License

ANYONE offering a "SERVICE" FROM THEIR HOME, FOR COMPENSATION, REQUIRES A Tooele City Business License. Even it if it considered a home business; a license is required. You can access our Business License Application on our website at http://www.tooelecity.org. Go to the "Department Drop Down List" to City Recorder, there

is a list of applications to the left of the screen and the Business License Application is the first one. There are notaries at city hall for the 2nd page of the application. It takes a few days to go through the approval process. After being approved, the City Recorder's Office will contact you regarding payment of the \$40 fee. After payment, your Business License Certificate will be mailed to you. If you have any other questions, you may call the Recorder's Office at (435) 843-2110. Thank you for your cooperation!

Attention Contractors: Contractors who live within Tooele City, you are required to have a Tooele City Business License, even if you are licensed by the State. Technically you are operating a "home office" or "home business" and must be licensed. You can access our Business License Application on our website at http://www.tooelecity.org. If you have any questions you may call the Recorder's Office at (435) 843-2110. Thank you!

All door-to-door salesmen (itinerant/transient merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a VIBRANT BLUE Tooele City ID badge on and in plain sight. If they aren't wearing a badge and it is during the day, call the Recorder's Office at (435) 843-2110. If it is the weekend or evening call dispatch at 882-5600 and they will have a police officer respond to your area. Thank you for your help.
