CONCERT, FIREWORKS & GOOD CAUSES



ANYONE offering a "service" from their home for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Even if it is considered a home business, a license is required. You can access our Business License Application on our website at http://www.tooelecity.org, go to the drop down list to City Recorder. Choose the Business License Application from the list to the left of the screen. The 2nd page needs to be notarized but we have notaries at Tooele City Hall. It takes a few days to go through the approval process. After being approved, you will be contacted about payment. Your certificate will then be mailed to you.

Parking on the 4th of July

Tooele Police would like to remind everyone there is no parking allowed on the July 4th parade route. Parking on the route creates hazardous conditions for the children by forcing them into the street dangerously close to the procession. Police will be out early checking the route and getting vehicles moved off the route as needed. Remember the parade route streets are: 200 South (east of Main), Main Street, 400 North (west of Main) and 200 West to Vine. You can contact the city parks department (843-2143) for exact route details. Police would also like to remind parents to monitor their children closely during the parade to ensure they remain a safe distance away from the parade procession. This is most problematic when candy falls too close to the procession. As long as citizens are mindful of these rules and recommendations, we are confident the parade will be safe and fun for all.
