

NEW ONLINE UTILITY BILL PAY

Tooele City is excited to announce its new Online Bill Payment System: Xpress Bill Pay.

Tooele City has partnered with Xpress Bill Pay for online utility payments. This new online payment system features many new and user-friendly services which will save you time and give you more flexibility in how you pay your bill. In addition to being able to pay your bill from the convenience of your home, Xpress Bill Pay will allow customers to:

- * Pay your utility bill with a debit or credit card or use a check from your checking account.
- * Schedule your monthly payments in advance and have the funds taken out on the day of your choice.
- Set up auto-pay and have your bill paid automatically each month on the day of your choice.
- Receive an email receipt confirming your online payment.
- Save a stamp and gas by paying your bill online for free!
- View your entire bill online, including all charges and meter readings. This new online bill will be very similar to the paper bill you receive in the mail.

- * Choose online statements and begin receiving your statements online.
- * View up to one year's history on your account, giving you the ability to compare current bills to those the same period a year ago.
- Print a year's history of payments at tax time.

Setting up your online account is FREE and EASY. Log on to www.tooelecity.org and click on "Pay Utilities". Once you are in Xpress Bill Pay click on "New to Xpress Bill Pay" and
