From the Mayor

First, let me address next year's fiscal budget. I would just like to add a couple of points to the well written article by Mr. Tim Gillie, in last week's Transcript Bulletin. It's very important that each of you know I will not be raising your taxes or any fees that are currently in place within the city. It is my responsibility as Mayor to work within the framework of the revenues we have. If revenues decrease, as they have due to the current recession, then my responsibility to each of you is to lower city expenses. The budget I have presented to the city council does just that. I will NOT compromise your level of city services and I will NOT ask you to pay higher taxes. I, and my administration, have planned for and identified areas in the budget that can be reduced. Those reductions have taken

place. At the same time we are aggressively looking at ways to replace those lost revenues. We do that by attracting new businesses to our beautiful community. Economic development is, and always will be, a priority of my administration. Each of you deserve my best efforts to bring attractive, job creating businesses that create additional tax base.

I would like to acknowledge the Settlement Canyon Chapter of the Sons of the Pioneers for the wonderful project just completed and placed next to the Library. It commemorates the mud wall built around Tooele City to protect the settlers from Indian attacks. I salute them for the wonderful job they did. I thank them for bringing that part of the history of this special city vividly to life as a constant reminder of our past. It was very

special to my wife and I to be asked to participate in the dedication.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.


Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas.


