

Letter to Tooele County Registered Voters:

We now have the primary Election under our belts. It's time to elect the people you want to represent Tooele City for the next 4 years. The candidates running for Mayor are Patrick Dunlavy (incumbent) and Becky J. Bracken. Candidates for City Council are: John L. Hansen (incumbent), Laura E. Liddell, Shawn Milne and Scott Wardle (incumbent). To find out more information on each of them, please go to the County Clerk's website at www.co.tooele.ut.us/clerk.htm, click on "Candidate Biographies." You will be asked for your name, birth date and house number. This website will show that you are registered, where your polling location is, and show you a sample of the ballot for the general election. It will also allow you to click on each candidate's name and read their biography, if they have submitted one.

Early Voting will be available again this year, However, it has been reduced to one location for easier access. All Early Voting for Tooele City residents will be at the Tooele County Health Department, 151 N. Main, Room 110. Early Voting will run from October 20th-30th from 8 am to 7 pm, Monday through Friday. In order to

be able to Early Vote you must be registered by October 5, 2009.

If you have recently moved to Tooele County, or have moved within Tooele County, you may register to vote by mail until October 5th, or in person in the Clerk's Office by October 19th. You can access a registration form at www.co.tooele.ut.us/clerk.htm, or call the Clerk's Office and we will send one to you. Please remember valid ID is required for all voting, whether it be Early Voting or on Election Day. Valid ID means: one form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter which may include a) a current, valid Utah driver license; b) a current, valid identification card; c) a current, valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon; d) a current, valid United States passport; or e) a valid tribal identification card (whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter).


