WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills. If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.




