Our streets department does an excellent job keeping city streets clear of snow. City ordinance prohibits



parking on city streets between the hours of 2 am to 6 am during the winter months. Please help city snowplow drivers by not parking on the streets and keeping things like basketball hoops off the streets!

Anyone offering a "service" from their home for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. This includes **contractors** even though licensed by the State. You can access the Business License Application on the city's website at www.tooelecity.org. Go to the "Department Drop Down list" to City Recorder. You will see a list of applications to the left of the screen. The Business License Application is the first one. Fill out the application (2nd page needs to be notarized). After being approved you will be contacted regarding payment of the \$40 fee. After payment, your Business License Certificate will be mailed to you. If you have questions, call the Recorder's Office at (435) 832-2110.

BUSINESS OWNERS: You have until January 31st to pay for your business license renewal fee. On February 1st a 50% late fee will be implemented. You can drop your payment off in the city Finance Department or in their drop box to the south of City Hall. You can also pay your renewal online. If you are no longer in business or if you have any questions, you may contact the Recorders Office at (435) 843-2110 or lisac@tooelecity.org.

All door-to-door salesmen (itinerant/transient merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a PURPLE Tooele City ID badge on and in plain sight. If they aren't wearing a badge and it is during the day, call the Recorder's Office at (435) 843-2110. If it's the weekend or evening, call 882-5600. An officer will respond to your area. Thank you for your help.



Keep your driveway and walks clear so that firefighters, medics and postal workers can reach your house or business.

Ensure all private roads are kept clear so fire apparatus and ambulances can reach your home. Remove all snow and ice adjacent to emergency exits, especially those exits that are infrequently used.

Keep snow and ice cleared from outside stairs.

If a major storm occurs, the fire hydrants nearest your home should be kept clear so that firefighters can readily locate and use it.

Ensure your pets are kept safe and secure when outside temperatures are below freezing.

FREE TAX SERVICE

If your household income is below \$49,000 per year, you may qualify for an Earned Income Tax Credit of up to \$5,600 even if you don't owe any taxes!

Part of Tooele City Code 4-11-17 states:

(1) It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within twenty-four hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming.

(2) It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic.




