I know there is concern about the potential for some degree of flooding this year, in some locations of the city. I wanted to take this opportunity to keep you informed of the work we are doing to prepare. We have learned some very important lessons over the years in dealing with previous incidents. Much has been done over the years to alleviate serious flooding problems that are under the control of Tooele City. Some examples include the control ditch on 700 South, and piping and diversion boxes which have been installed in other areas around the city. Tooele City is taking this year's flood potential very seriously. We have been working on opening areas of drainage, stock piling sand bags, as well as readying our concrete barri-

ers, if they are needed. We have been working on these things for many weeks now, and we will continue working on them for as long as necessary. We have placed sand behind City Hall, at Coleman and 700 South, and at England Acres Park so those of you who want to, can fill sand bags yourselves. The bags are available from the City; contact the Public Works Department at 843-2132 or 843-2130. If we are not completely overwhelmed with unforeseen, large volumes of runoff water, we will be prepared and able to handle it. If you have concerns about your area, please call the public works numbers I've mentioned, we will be very happy to address your concerns. If you see problem areas after we've done our prepara-

let tions, us know about them as well. Let's hope the weather cooperates and melting takes place over time and at a controlled pace. If weather

does cooperate, flooding won't be a problem—if it does not, we will be ready.

WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and school may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten registration for Fall 2011 enrollment is currently being held at all elementary schools through the end of May 2011. Each child entering kindergarten must have a prescreening assessment. This assessment will be scheduled by your school prior to the end of this school year. It is important to have your child registered to receive an assessment time. To be eligible to enter kindergarten, your child must be at least five (5) years of age on or before September 1, 2011. Tooele City will provide the tools and water. Instruction will follow the Junior Master Gardener curriculum.


