Local Girl Scout's Recycling Service Project

Kaylee Morris is 11 years old and a Girl Scout Cadet who is working on her Silver Award. In February of 2012, she began a new recycling service project to earn her Silver Award, and she hopes everyone in the community will help.

Always passionate about recycling, Kaylee says, "We read this recycling book that said if you didn't recycle, the world would get all trashy. It reminds me of 'Wall-E'. I don't want our world to turn out like that." For her service project, she decided to collect used writing utensils and glue sticks to be recycled by the company Terracycle, which will make a donation based on the weight of all the items she collects to a charity of Kaylee's choice. Kaylee chose the Tooele City Library to receive the donation to go toward purchasing books for the Young Adult section.

Kaylee has placed collection boxes all over Tooele City, including one at every elementary school, Utah State University Tooele Campus, The Family Center, the Tooele County School District office and the Tooele City Library. You can donate the following used items: highlighters, glue sticks, pens, pencils (all types), dry erasers, and markers. Collection boxes will be available until June of 2013.

According to Kaylee, besides the books purchased for the library, her project will also help "schools, Tooele City, the PTA and the environment!" She said, "What I see is a big old field filled with trash and when I come in, it's all pretty again with flowers growing!" The Girl Scout program has truly empowered Kaylee, teaching her to look for creative ways to improve her school, her community and the world.

The Great Utah ShakeOut

Utah has experienced damaging earthquakes in the past and geologic evidence indicates that earthquakes, larger than any experienced locally in historical time, are likely in the future. Everyone is encouraged to become better prepared for major earthquakes and practice how to be better protected when earthquakes happen. The purpose of the Great Utah ShakeOut exercise, to be held on **April 17, 2012**, is to help people and organizations become ready and reduce losses. At 10:15 a.m. on that date, emergency sirens will be activated. At that time, we would like everyone to participate in the “**Drop, Cover and Hold On**” drill. **Drop** to the floor, take **Cover** under a table or desk and **Hold On** to it as if a major earthquake were happening (stay down for at least 60 seconds). While still under the table, or wherever you are, look around and imagine what would happen in a major earthquake. What would fall on you or others? What would be damaged? What would life be like after? What could you do before the actual earthquake happens to reduce losses and quickly recover? 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EARTHQUAKE QUIZ



1. In the event of an earthquake while sleeping?
 - A. Roll on to the floor next to the bed.
 - B. Get in a doorway.
 - C. Stay in your bed and protect your head with a pillow.

Next step - assess your surroundings and put on shoes before getting out of bed. Move beds away from windows, mirrors and framed pictures. Make sure that heavy objects in the home are securely tied down. Store at least three gallons of water per person and keep a first aid kit in the house.

2. In the event of an earthquake while at the beach.
 - A. Run into the water.
 - B. Drop and cover until the shaking stops.
 - C. Run away from the water.

Next step - if you observe the water receding from the shoreline in an unusually rapid manner, move immediately to higher ground to avoid a tsunami.

3. In the event of an earthquake while driving.
 - A. Pull over to the side of the road, avoid overpasses, trees and electrical wires and set the parking brake.
 - B. Drive to an area where no other vehicles are around.
 - C. Stop your car and get out.

Next step - stay in your car until the shaking is over. Tune to a news source. If power lines fall on your car, stay inside and wait for help.

4. In the event of an earthquake while at work.
 - A. Run out of the building.
 - B. Get under a nearby desk or table and hold on until the shaking stops.
 - C. Call 9-1-1 to report the earthquake.

Next step - assess your surroundings and check yourself for injuries before helping others. Follow your building emergency procedures and call 9-1-1 only if you have a life threatening emergency. Keep a pair of sturdy shoes and a dusk mask in your work go-bag. Secure heavy objects that could cause injury or block exits.

5. In the event of an earthquake while using public transportation.
 - A. Exit the vehicle as quickly as possible.
 - B. Keep listening to your music until the vehicle comes to a stop.
 - C. Stay in your seat and protect your head and neck with your arms.

Next step - assess your surroundings and wait for evacuation instructions from the operator or public safety personnel.

6. In the event of an earthquake while dining out.
 - A. Get under a table and hold on until the shaking stops.
 - B. Protect your food.
 - C. Run to the nearest exit.

Next step - assess your surroundings and then exit slowly, watching for falling objects like windows, bricks or building facades.

Answers 1-C, 2-B, 3-A, 4-B, 5-C, 6-A.

WAY TO GO, TOOEELE!

On January 18, 2012, the Tooele City Council passed a zoning Ordinance regulating the location of tobacco specialty stores in Tooele. The ordinance bans tobacco specialty stores from locating within 1,500 feet of any school, youth center, recreational facility, park, library, church, residential area or other tobacco stores as well as prohibiting them from locating on Vine Street (existing shops are not affected by this ordinance at this time). The ordinance was passed unanimously among the five-member council.

Tooele City Attorney, Roger Baker, provided science and reason to establish a sound base for this ordinance. Research has shown that exposure and perceived availability are major reasons that young people start to use substances and these things also inhibit the success of those who are trying to overcome habits of use. Concern was also raised regarding various other products that are often found and sold in tobacco specialty stores, examples are designer drugs such as 'Spice' and 'Bath Salts'. Don't let the labels fool you: these substances are dangerous!

The City Council chambers were overflowing with many people in our community; prevention specialists, educators, health department staff on both state and local levels, youth advocates and concerned citizens were all in attendance to show their support of this ordinance. Melanie Castagno, Tooele County School District Tobacco Prevention Specialist, addressed the council using local statistics and concerns that also supported the implementation of this ordinance. Several others also addressed the Council, including young people who have personal interest in providing laws like this to protect our youth and limit their exposure to dangerous substances and problem behaviors.

Mayor Patrick Dunlavy shared gratitude and applause to the City Council members, as well as City Attorney Roger Baker, and members of the community who came forward to speak in support of this ordinance. He stated, "I want to express appreciation for the Council's proactive stance in this area. I would also like to applaud Mr. Baker in his efforts and extensive research that he put in to the writing of this ordinance. It is our responsibility as elected officials, to protect the people in our community and passing this ordinance is an essential part of doing that."

Many of us in the prevention community would like to tip our hats to our great municipal leadership. Tooele citizens and government officials are taking a stand to provide and safeguard a healthy environment for our young people and families. We thank the Council, Mayor Dunlavy and his administration as well as the great citizens of Tooele, for setting a precedent of health and wellness in our community. Job well done!
