As I have followed many cities around the state, I have noted that Taylorsville, West Jordan and others are raising their citizen's property taxes—each of you need to know we are NOT. We are also NOT raising user fees this year.

I'm very proud of our ability to manage your taxes the way we have. I firmly believe you elected us to provide quality public services. We have police and fire departments that are unmatched; employees who are hard-working, honest people; and we do this while managing your money without

adding to your tax burden. At the same time we are leading out in completing much needed projects, such as the expansion of the wastewater treatment plant and adding to our precious water supply.

City Offices will be closed on July 4th for Independence Day and July 24th for Pioneer Day. Garbage will not be collected on these days—services will be delayed one day starting with the holiday.

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Thank you for your help in conserving water, a precious resource.

8-3-14. BURNING OF SOLID WASTE; RECREATIONAL FIRES



(1) General Rule. No person shall, for the purpose of final disposal thereof, burn on any lot, street, alley, gutter or on any land, public or private, any solid waste.

(2) Exception. Recreational or cooking fires are allowed by persons on their own property so long as:

- (a)** the recreational or cooking intention for the fire is evident;
- (b)** the fire pile height does not exceed 12 inches above the bottom of the fire ring, fire pit, or other fire containing structure at any time;
- (c)** the fire is contained within a noncombustible fire ring, fire pit, or other fire containing structure no larger than 36 inches in diameter;
- (d)** fire extinguishing items are immediately on-hand (e.g., hose, shovel, water bucket, fire extinguisher); and,
- (e)** the fire does not become a smoke or fume nuisance to neighboring properties. (Ord. 93-18)

8-3-16. Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation who violates the terms of this Chapter by any act of omission or commission shall be deemed guilty of a class C misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof may be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$750.00 and to imprisonment in the Tooele County Jail not exceeding 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Every violator of the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each day such violation shall continue and shall be subject to penalty imposed by this Section for each and every such separate offense. (Ord. 93-18, 10-01-93)

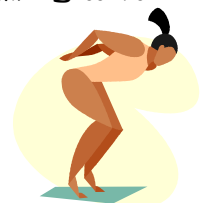
