From Mayor Dunlavy...

As Election Day nears, I hope you let your voice be heard by casting your ballot. This is such a special right we have.

Each of our votes helps determine who represents us.

On November 6th, the Parks, Arts and Recreation (PAR) proposal is on the ballot. On the ballot, it will appear as:

Tooele City Proposal #1 the wording does not say PAR, it says: **"Shall Tooele City, Utah reauthorize a 1/10th of 1% sales and use tax to fund cultural facilities, cultural organizations, and recreational facilities in Tooele City?"**



PAR is a 1/10th of 1% sales and use tax,

which means, if you spend \$100 on groceries only 10 cents goes toward PAR.

The PAR program has been in effect since 2004, so this is not a new proposal, but a request to allow the existing program to continue. We have accomplished much with the monies from this program. It helped fund the new Skyline Park and add additional open space. We've added new pavilions to our existing parks; put in the splash pad at the swimming pool; as well as new playground equipment in parks throughout the City.

We've also brought the Arts back to Tooele and established the Tooele City Arts Council. Through the Arts Council we have the Fridays on Vine concerts series and the week-long 4th of July activities with the spectacular fireworks display and concert. We are able to provide craft classes,

photography classes and art classes with exceptional instructors. We're very proud of the things we've accomplished. I hope you are as well. Thank you for your support in the past.

Thanks so much for the super feedback I've gotten about last month's message about negativity; I appreciate your comments so much.

Thanks to all of you for helping to making our City the great place it is. As always I will continue to protect your tax investment in Tooele City, make sound decisions and continue to work hard every day for the betterment of our beautiful city.

Clerk's Insider

We have received a number of calls from voters concerned that they received a by-mail ballot and did not request one. During the Republican Caucus forms were available for voters to sign which put them on the by-mail voter list. Many voters signed these forms not realizing they were signing up to vote by-mail. If you have received a by-mail ballot and prefer to vote in person, please do the following: 1) Bring your unvoted by-mail ballot to the poll with you. Utah State law requires that your by-mail ballot be "surrendered" to the poll worker before they can issue you a "ballot" to vote in person; 2) On the by-mail ballot that you are surrendering, write "REMOVE NAME". That will tell me to remove your name from the by-mail list when I get the surrendered ballots back in the office.

So why did the Republican Party go to the work and expense of printing off all of those forms to encourage people to vote by-mail? Because statistics show that by-mail precincts have a higher voting rate than regular voting. For example, one Tooele County precinct which has always had a high voting percentage (53%) was made a Permanent By-Mail Precinct. Their voting percentage went to 82%.

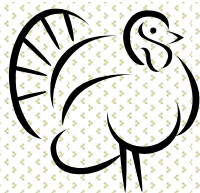


Santa Claus is Coming to Town!

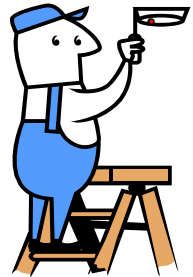
