On Monday, July 15th, we cut the ribbon on the new solids handling facility at the Tooele City Water Reclamation Facility. The completion of our new solids handling facility means we are now able to reuse 99% of the water and solid waste coming into the plant. Both the reuse water and the solids material, that can be use as fertilizer, will become а verv valuable for the resource city, generating revenue and saving the city money. I'm very proud of the project we've completed there. Our solids facility is the only one of its kind in the United States. It took a great deal of courage to choose this process, but it has exceeded our expectations many times over.

We will be doing some significant road maintenance projects in the coming weeks. The largest will involve Utah Avenue from Main Street west to the railroad crossing on SR112. It involves new water service lines as well as a complete overlay of road the surface. Please bear with us, there will
