Summer came a bit early this year, so I'm making a request to each of you. Since the warm weather has come earlier than usual, I'm very concerned with the large usage experiencing. Never before, in recent memory, has the amount of water being used reached this level so early in the season. I know we talk about water conservation every year and most do a wonderful job helping conserve and I appreciate that.

We are currently drilling a new well and later this summer we will start on another new well; we do that to stay ahead of normal city demands, but at the current level of usage, we will be in a serious situation later in the summer.

Businesses and residents need to start watering differently. We've given many water saving tips over the years. I really need each of you to take water conservation seriously. We all need to work together for the betterment of us all.

We've worked hard to do our part. Most of our large park areas are watered with irrigation water, not city culinary water; we are also on a restricted schedule. Please help! Change your habits and follow the conservation schedule. If we all get on board, we'll all benefit. If we don't, then at this very large usage level, we will all pay a price later on.

In May, the Water Environment Association of Utah presented the Outstanding B i o - s o l i d s

Program Award to Tooele City's Waste Water Reclamation Facility (WWRF) commonly referred to as the sewer plant.

This is a significant achievement for the City, as it recognizes the City's effort and dedication to an efficient and safe treatment of waste water. The investment the community has made in the WWRF reduces environmental impacts and saves tens of thousands of dollars per year in operational costs, in addition to virtually eliminating the need for landfill space for treated material.

All this is due to the vision of the community to invest in the first-of-its-kind technology in this country, right here in Tooele. And now the City has been recognized for the merits, benefits, and successful implementation of its program by the state's affiliate to the Water Environment Federation. This is not a simple accomplishment and is one that should be celebrated for our community!

#### Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users north of Vine and west of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users north of Vine and east of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users south of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Thank you for your help in conserving water, a precious resource.


