SR-36 RENEWED

3 O'Clock Drive to 2000 North

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), in coordination with Tooele City, is designing the full pavement reconstruction of SR-36 from 3 O'Clock Drive to 1280 North and pavement rehabilitation (rotomill and overlay) from 1280 North to 2000 North.

The following items will be included in the project:

3 O'CLOCK DRIVE TO 1280 NORTH

- Remove and replace pavement
- Install new storm drain
- Replace deficient curb, gutter and sidewalk
- Upgrade pedestrian ramps to meet ADA standards
- Complete utility work to accommodate road work

1280 NORTH TO 2000 NORTH

- Remove and replace the top 1" of road
- Install curb and gutter on east side of roadway
- Complete drainage improvements on east side of roadway

Once the project is complete, the pavement life will be extended another 10 to 30 years and the corridor will have consistent features that enhance safety.

The design team is currently collecting information about the existing conditions. Project personnel will be performing survey work on-site through November. Once complete, the project team will analyze the data and begin design.

The design phase will continue through early 2015. We anticipate construction will begin in late spring of 2015 and conclude by the end of the year. At this time, we do not have information on potential construction or property impacts. We'll provide additional information as the design phase progresses. Once a contractor is selected in early spring of 2015, we will be able to provide additional details on where and when construction will take place and how traffic will be maintained within the work zone.

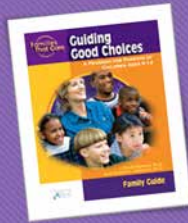


What to do when you see an Emergency Vehicle approaching!

This may seem like common sense to some, but when dealing with emergency situations we commonly see drivers panic and over-react or react incorrectly when they see an emergency vehicle approaching them. Here are some rules to remember:

1. You must yield the right of way.
2. Drive to the far right edge of the curb.
3. Clear the intersection.
4. You must STOP!

When you see an emergency vehicle approaching, (if possible) pull your vehicle to the far right side of the roadway. If you can't pull right then leave room for the emergency vehicle to get by. If you are already stopped, stay put! Once the emergency vehicle has passed, be sure to re-enter the travel lane with caution. Always keep the intersection clear because you don't know which way the emergency vehicle will have to go. As curious as you may be, do not follow an emergency vehicle leaving a scene. Finally, if you come to an intersection blocked by emergency vehicles, slow down! Watch for directions given by police personnel on the scene and proceed as directed.

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS!

Business License Renewals for 2015 should be arriving just after December 1, 2014. You can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall OR leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box to the south of City Hall. You have through the month of January to renew your license. On February 1, 2015 a 50% late fee will be assessed. If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing lisac@tooelecitey.org or fax (435) 843-2119 and we will close your license. If you have any questions or concerns, please call the Recorder's Office at (435) 843-2110. Thank you!

Anyone offering a service from their home, for compensation, must have a Tooele City Business License! Call the Tooele City Recorder's Office (435) 843-2110 for more information.

ALL door-to-door salesmen (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a **2014 Bright YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge** on and in plain sight. 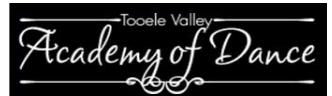
