

From the Mayor . . .

It is time once again for our annual reminder about water conservation. Over the last couple of weeks we've seen a huge increase in our water use. As a City we've added wells, and upgraded our delivery system so that we are able to deal with the higher usage during hotter weather; however, the usage happening now is extreme.

Also to consider is the fact that the irrigation water supply from the Settlement Canyon Irrigation Company and from the Middle Canyon Irrigation Company will be much less this year. We all need to start a very concerted effort to use less water. If we don't, the end result will be lower water pressure even lower than it is now. In extreme cases, areas of our community will go through times without water as our system recharges itself during the nighttime hours.

All of this can be totally avoided if we use less and water more efficiently. We are able to meet normal water demands, but what we've seen is troublesome.

I'm asking you and your neighbors to do your part. I've asked each of you to voluntarily conserve, and up until the last few weeks we've been doing great. Let's do this together.

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.


Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Fireworks Safety Tips from the Tooele City Police Department

*Leave Fireworks to the Professionals. The best way to protect your family is to not use any fireworks at home. Instead, attend public fireworks displays and leave the lighting to the professionals. If you plan to use fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area. <u>Please check our website</u> <u>www.tooelecity.org for possible restrictions in Tooele City</u>.

*Be Extra Careful With Sparklers. Little arms are too short to hold sparklers, which can heat up to 1,200 degrees. How about this? Let your young children use glow sticks instead. They can be just as fun but they don't burn at a temperature hot enough to melt glass. Closely supervise children around fireworks at all times.

*Take Necessary Precautions. Do not wear loose clothing while using fireworks. Never light fireworks indoors or near dry grass. Point fireworks away from homes, and keep away from brush, leaves and flammable substances

*Be Prepared for an Accident or Injury. Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to

investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it. Always have a bucket of water and/or a fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate the fire extinguisher properly. If a child is injured by fireworks, immediately go to a doctor or hospital. If an eye injury occurs, don't allow your child to touch or rub it, as this may cause even more damage.




