very important County election; be informed, and most importantly VOTE! Not being involved or not being counted should not happen, especially in Tooele County elections right now.

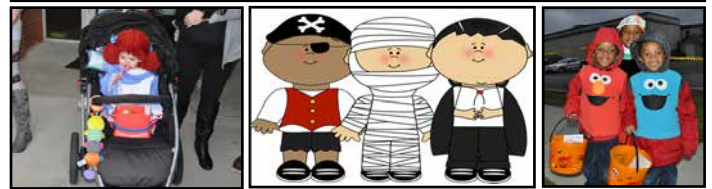

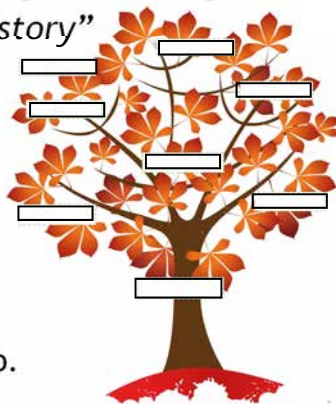

As we come to the completion of another season of road improvement work, we appreciate your patience as this work has been getting done. We understand that road work can be impactful to residents living in these areas but we make every effort possible to get the work done as quickly as possible.

We regularly get asked about how we select the work that will be done in any one year. As a quick explanation, every road is evaluated every year. Roads that are in need of work are prioritized by the condition of the road. Roads with structural concerns are further prioritized: (1) based on the condition of the road, (2) whether an overlay or a full rebuild project is needed, and (3) the typical traffic volume of the road. Other roads are identified for slurry seal projects. Slurry seal is a very effective method used to preserve and extend the life of roads that are holding together well. Slurry seal is a very thin application (approximately 1/8") that doesn't affect the function of the road (slurry seal corrects and prevents problems and the road is ready to use just hours after application). All of this has to be balanced against the available budgets for such projects.

Mayor Dunlavy and the administration have done an excellent job of keeping our City financially strong while maintaining our ability to do a certain amount of these projects each year. The money to do road projects comes largely from state road maintenance funds, not the City's general fund. Following the administration's lead, we must be prudent with the money spent on such projects. Slurry seals cost around 10% of an overlay per square foot and rebuilding usually doubles the cost of overlaying. We would love to do more paving and rebuilding, but that just isn't possible with the funds we have available so we have to prioritize and work smarter.

We hope that you, your families and friends have a Happy and SAFE Halloween. Here are some safety tips for children and adults:

1. Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
2. Add reflective tape to costumes and bags.
3. Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible, instead of masks which can obstruct vision.
4. Make sure swords, canes, or sticks are short and not sharp.
5. Prepare flashlights with fresh batteries for children and escorts.
6. Examine all treats for choking hazards and signs of tampering. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
7. Walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic.
8. Only visit homes with a porch light on and never enter a home or car for a treat.
9. Teach children to call 911 if they have an emergency or become lost.
10. If your older children are going alone, plan and review the route that is acceptable to you. Agree on a specific time when they should return home.

Business License Required

Anyone offering a "Service" from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Call the Tooele City Recorder's Office (435) 843-2110 for more information. ALL door-to-door salesmen (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a **2014 Bright YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge** on and in plain sight. If salesmen aren't wearing a badge, please report them to (435) 843-2110 or (435) 882-5600. (Dispatch will need a description of the individual along with the direction they are headed). Thank you.
