

Election Day—November 3rd!

Tooele City residents will have the opportunity to cast their vote for three open City Council positions. Four candidates

are running for those positions: Dave McCall, Brad Pratt, Steve Pruden and Jay Collier. To read profiles on the candidates, please go to vote.utah.gov. Other items on your ballot: The Tooele County Commission has placed the Local Option Sales Tax on the ballot. If approved it will provide sales tax to help pay for the roads in Tooele City as well as the rest of the County. The Tooele County School District has also placed a bond proposition on the ballot.

For more information on the Local Option Sales Tax and the School Bond, please go to the Clerk's website. In fact, there is a wealth of information to be found on the Clerk's webpage under the elections tab (http://www.co.tooele.ut.us/clerk/ Elections.htm). You can see your sample ballot, read candidate profiles (for those who have provided them), candidate financial forms, and which polling location is closest to your work or home.

Scam artists in the U.S. and around the world defraud millions of people each year. They use the phone, email, postal mail, and the internet to trick you into sending money or giving out personal information. Here are 10 ways to avoid fraud:

(1) Know who you're dealing with; (2) Know that wiring money is like sending cash; (3) Read your monthly statements; (4) After a disaster, give to only established charities; (5) Talk to your doctor before you buy health products or special treatments; (6) Remember, there is no sure thing in investing; (7) Don't send money to someone you don't know; (8) Don't agree to deposit a check and wire money back; (9) Don't reply to messages asking for personal or financial information; (10) Don't play foreign lottery.

Also, ALL door-to-door salesmen (Itinerant/ Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2015 Bright PINK Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If salesmen aren't wearing badges, please call (435) 843-2110 or Dispatch at (435) 882-5600. (Dispatch will need a description of the Individual along with the direction they are headed).
