During the upcoming month, ACE Disposal will be placing a recycling bin in the gravel parking lot behind City Hall at our request. This bin will be a trial run to see how well the program is received. If it goes well, placing additional recycling bins around the community will be considered.

The following is a brief summary of acceptable and unacceptable recyclable items:

Acceptable items include: PAPER: Newspaper, wrapping paper, telephone books, catalogs, brochures/ magazines.

CARDBOARD: Boxes, drink cartons.

PLASTICS 1-7: Water bottles, milk jugs, soda bottles.

METALS:Tin cans, aluminum cans, clean aluminum foil.

Unacceptable items include: clothing, household trash, grass & yard waste, glass of any kind, e-waste and hazardous waste.

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users north of Vine and west of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users north of Vine and east of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users south of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

SOURCE PROTECTION

Drinking Water Protection Plan for Tooele City is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources, and management strategies to protect each of our drinking water sources. Potential contamination sources common in our protection areas include sanitary sewer lines, septic tanks, roads, residential, commercial and industrial areas, etc. These sources of potential contamination are typically classified as a low susceptibility. Sources which are classified as medium susceptibility include buried fuel storage tanks, accidental spills of potential contaminants, or other similar conditions. The City has developed management strategies to further protect all of our sources from contamination. Contact the Public Works Dept. at 435-843-2130, for questions or concerns about our source protection plan.
