City Offices will be closed on Wednesday, July 4th for Independence Day. City Offices will also be closed on Tuesday, July 24th in observance of Pioneer Day. Garbage will not be collected on those days. Services will be delayed one day starting with the holiday during those weeks.

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn—contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches in height. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches in height.

Speed Limits

Tooele City remains committed to providing the best possible service and transportation system throughout the community within the confines of available resources. This includes examining our system for efficiencies. One such effort is an on-going review of the speed limits assigned to certain streets by the Public Works and Police Departments. Not every street will be reviewed, but a number of those streets that are designed and intended to convey traffic through the community have been and are being reviewed. Examples include Tooele Boulevard south of Utah Avenue, Skyline Drive, 400 West north of 1000 North, Smelter Road and 400 North east of Main Street, and others. Some roads may see a change in the speed limit and others may not. Factors being considered in this review include data collected for traffic volumes and speed, size and design of the street, adjacent development, and accident data. As always we encourage drivers to remain alert at all times when driving and adhere to the posted speed limit.

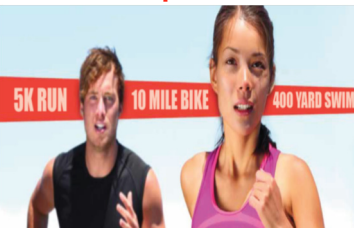
