City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.



- Adoption of City Ordinance and reliance of County Ordinance which regulate potential hazards to the City's drinking water sources, and
- Collecting and analyzing water quality data to evaluate watershed protection efforts.

TRASH/DEBRIS ITEMS:

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner. Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly

or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety;

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept and must be placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) of Tooele City code states such vehicles will be deemed a nuisance: (a) junked, wrecked, or inoperable motor vehicles upon real property, for longer than 72 hours, except that up to 2 such vehicles or parts thereof may be stored within an enclosed building or completely screened by a sight-obscuring fence. (d) Abandoned motor vehicles.

Ideas to Clean Up and Beautify Your Yard

- □ Sweep sidewalks, curbs, and gutters
- □ Mow, pull, or spray weeds*
- □ Clear away fallen limbs, branches, and leaves
- □ Cut back overgrowth (bushes, vines, trees, shrubbery)
- □ Clear your yard from trash, debris, and clutter
- □ Clean up and re-edge flower beds and borders
- □ Great time to prep lawns for spring growth (rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed)
- □ Mow grass and redefine borders of the lawn
- □ Neaten up hardscape surfaces (sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, porches)
- Clear obstructions (trees, vines, bushes) from sidewalks and roads

*Section 8-4-4 1(a) of Tooele City code states *a*ny weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owner is responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Violation of this code may result in fines and/or a class B misdemeanor.

Residential customers-take advantage of both bulk waste pick up days during May—at no cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulk waste pickup. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup during May. If by chance your bulk waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reasons they were unable to pick up your items. Frequently Asked Questions about Bulk Waste

When does Bulk Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulk waste pickup program. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those items which do not normally fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our city and keeping it clean. This May you will get an additional day. See the schedule on this page.

Will Bulk Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! We accept old appliances (items must have freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulk waste pickup?

Yes! Bulk Waste will take your yard waste, such as branches. limbs, and shrubbery but it MUST be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine) and be cut to less than 5 feet and cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulk Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulk waste pick up. However, you can dispose of those at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on May 5th!
