Tooele County residents and visitors can now receive life-saving emergency alerts and advanced warning of severe weather directly to their Android or Apple iOS device, or receive a call, text, email, or call to your home with TooeleAlerts.

Alerts may include information about imminent danger such as active shooter, health hazards, HAZMAT, wildfire, floods, immediate evacuations, major road closures, and major power outages.

WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Celebrating 100 Years!

During the first 10 years of service to the citizens of Tooele City, the Tooele City Fire Department had many accomplishments as an organization. In 1919, the Fire Dept. held a siren dance to earn enough money to purchase a new siren and replace the old fire bell that was located on City Hall. It was requested that the fire bell be placed in permanent working condition as in the past it had been necessary to put a ladder against the side of the City Hall, climb up the roof to the bell tower, and sound the bell by hand. Sometimes the ladder was not to be found and it was essential that the bell be rung from the ground. The dance was successful, and enough money was raised to purchase the small siren. The City built the tower. When the siren was installed, the Fire Dept. held another dance to celebrate the first blowing of the siren for the community. A voting contest was sponsored by the Department to see which lucky lady got to press the button and sound the new siren.

During 1927, a movement was started in Tooele to secure a sewer system and at the February 13 fire meeting the department went on record as favoring the same and was willing to work to put it in. During this period and for several years to come, the fire department together with the American Legion and the Eagles were the most civic minded organizations in our town. The project was approved and the City sewer system was started.

In April of 1927, the Board of Fire Underwriters announced that due to the effective work of the Fire Dept., fire insurance rates in the City would be reduced. In the spring of 1927, the Bauer Plant caught fire. Phil Merry, the superintendent of the Bauer plant, stated that he turned in the alarm at 1:05 AM and just 19 minutes later the fire department had two lines of hose on the fire. Tooele City Fire Department received a letter from the Board of Fire Underwriters commending them on the fine work they did and a month later the Combined Metals sent a check for \$200.00 thanking the Department for a job well done.

- Great time to prep lawns for spring growth (rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed).
- Get a free soil additive (Biosolids) from Tooele City to apply to your lawns, plants, and gardens. This product is available year round. Call 435-843-2132 for more info.
- Mow grass and redefine borders of the lawn.
- Neaten up hardscape surfaces (sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, porches).
- Clear obstructions (trees, vines, bushes) from sidewalks and roads.
- Patch, replace, or paint worn fences and gates.
- Add a final touch! Plant flowers and plants to add color, beauty and fun to your home!

*Section 8-4-4 1(a) of Tooele City code states *any* weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owner is responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Violation of this code may result in fines and/or a class B misdemeanor.

BULK WASTE

BOX IT! BAG IT! BUNDLE IT!

(Some do's and don'ts)

For this type of pickup it is required to BAG, BUNDLE, or BOX your items. Your boxes, bundles, and bags cannot weight more than 75 lbs. Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is marked "FREE" or "PLEASE TAKE" or "GIVING AWAY". Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is leaning against fences or mailboxes. Do not park cars or other vehicles in front of your bulk waste or it may not be picked up. We ask you to set out your bulk waste the way you would want to pick it up.



Please do NOT put dirty containers in your recycling. The second largest contaminant in recycling is food waste. Please make sure to only toss clean and empty recyclables in your recycling bin! Questions? Call ACE Disposal at 801-363-9995 or email recycle@acedisposal.com.

Residential customers—take advantage of both bulk waste pick up days during May—at no cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulk waste pickup. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup during May. If by chance your bulk waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reason they were unable to pick up your items. For a complete list of acceptable & unacceptable items, and specific requirements, please visit our website tooelecity.org.

Frequently Asked Questions about Bulk Waste

When does Bulk Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulk waste pickup program. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those items which do not normally fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our city and keeping it clean. This May you will get an additional day. See the schedule on this page.

Will Bulk Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulk Waste accepts old appliances (items must have freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulk waste pickup?

Yes! Bulk Waste will take your yard waste, such as branches, limbs, and shrubbery but it MUST be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine), and must be less than 4 inches in diameter, be cut to less than 5 feet, and cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulk Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulk waste pick up. However, you can dispose of those at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on May 4th!
