Holiday Trash Pick Up Schedule


There will be no trash pick up services on the following days:

DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION ACT FOR CLEAN WATER



The Drinking Water Source Protection Plan for Tooele City is available for your review. It contains information about source protection zones, potential contamination sources, and management strategies to protect each of our drinking water sources. Potential contamination sources common in our protection areas include sanitary sewer lines, septic tanks, roads, residential, commercial and industrial areas, etc. These sources of potential contamination are typically classified as a low susceptibility. Sources which are classified as medium susceptibility include buried fuel storage tanks, accidental spills of potential contaminants, or other similar conditions. The City has developed management strategies to further protect all of our sources from contamination. Please contact the Public Works Department at (435) 843-2130, if you have questions or concerns about our source protection plan.



The new bike lanes on 100 East between 1000 North and Vine Street, and on Vine Street between 100 East and Tooele Boulevard were completed in October 2019. The lanes are now marked and signage is up. Here's how to navigate your motor vehicle and bicycle on the roads with bike lanes:

- In the non-green areas, there is a parking lane, a marked bike lane, a buffer lane, and a lane for motor vehicle travel. Everyone has their own lane. Always be cautious of bicycle and motor vehicle traffic.
- Where there are painted green lanes, motor vehicles and bicycles share the same green lanes, the same way motor vehicles share the lane.
 - ⇒ When there is a bicycle in the green area they have the legal right to use the entire travel lane as if they were a motor vehicle and motor vehicles have the responsibility to yield to their full use of the lane and follow behind them as they would any other vehicle on the road.
 - ⇒ If there are no bicycles present the motor vehicle has full use of the travel lane including in the green marked area as if there were no green markings.
- It is legal to turn across a double yellow line where they run parallel and close together (such as on 100 East and on Vine Street).
