What to do when you see an Emergency Vehicle approaching!

This may seem like common sense to some, but when dealing with emergency situations we commonly see drivers panic

and over-react or react incorrectly when they see an emergency vehicle with lights and sirens approaching them. Here are some rules to remember:

- 1. You must yield the right of way.
- 2. Drive to the far right edge of the curb.
- 3. Clear the intersection.
- 4. You must STOP!

When you see an emergency vehicle approaching, (if possible) pull your vehicle to the far right side of the roadway. If you can't pull right then leave room for the emergency vehicle to get by. If you are already stopped, stay put! Once the emergency vehicle has passed, be sure to re-enter the travel lane with caution. Always keep the intersection clear because you don't know which way the emergency vehicle will have to go. As curious as you may be, do not follow an emergency vehicle leaving a scene. Finally, if you come to an intersection blocked by emergency vehicles, slow down! Watch for directions given by police personnel on the scene and proceed as directed.

DON'T FEED THE WILD ANIMALS!



- If you feed wild animals it causes them to congregate in your neighborhood.
 - If you congregate wildlife, such as turkey and deer, it significantly increases the chances for disease transmission. It is better for their health if you don't congregate/feed them.
- If you feed wild animals and bring them closer to town, it causes issues and creates a situation where DWR must relocate them.
- Congregating turkey and deer brings in their predators.
- There is plenty of food outside of City limits that animals can feed on. The animals will not go hungry even if you don't feed them. Biologists are continually watching for the welfare of the animals.
- There are many online resources available to help you learn how to detract deer from your yard. Learn what vegetation you can plant that deer do not prefer and learn how to "Landscape for Wildlife".
- One suggestion is to put deer fencing up around your garden and the vegetation that the deer love to eat.

- If you see wildlife that has been hit and is on the road, please contact dispatch at 435-882-5600, or DWR, to report the address where the animal is laying and DWR will come and pick up the animal.

NEW! Snow Event Parking Restrictions



For many years, Tooele City had an ordinance in place that prohibited parking on any city street from November 1st to March 31st during the hours of 2:00 am to 6:00 am. In

May of 2020, the Tooele City Council voted to change that ordinance so the time restriction is no longer in place.

The ordinance now reads, "10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions"

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:
 - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
- (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City's snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this Section:
- (a) emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
- (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.
- (4) A violation of this Section is punishable by a civil penalty of \$100.



Just a reminder as the winter months approach, residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops, this is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: "It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to

remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, with 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming."

Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: "It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic." Please be courteous to your neighbors, do not blow leaves, snow or other debris into their yards. Thank you!


Please do not park your vehicles on the street (or on the park strip or the side-walk—they are also the right-of-way) when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated. Streets needs to be clear of vehicles, basketball hoops, and other obstructions for plows to safely and efficiently clear the streets. Trees should be trimmed to at least a 12'6" minimum so they do not obstruct or damage plows. Also, as a reminder, if your basketball hoop is on the park strip, please make sure the hoop itself doesn't hang over the street where it can get snagged on the snow plows.

LARGE VEHICLES — Per Tooele City Code, large vehicles such as semi-trucks, shall not park overnight on city streets other than designated truck routes. In section 10-2-7(3) the following are designated truck routes: "(a) SR-36 (Main Street); (b) SR-112; (c) Tooele Boulevard (1100 W. St.); (d) Droubay Road; (e) Pine Canyon Road; (f) other streets as designated by express written permission of the police chief..."

During the month of October, our Code Enforcement Dept. opened 9 new cases, closed 14 cases, and had 23 cases active and open. You can contact our Code Enforcement Officer with any questions or concerns at 435-843-2164 or via email at annc@tooelecity.org.

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS:

Business License Renewals for 2021 should be arriving just after December 1, 2020. You can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall or payment in the Utility leave your Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall. Please indicate on the envelope that payment is for a business license renewal and include your business license number. You have through the month of January to renew your license. On February 1, 2021 a 50% late fee will be assessed. If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing <u>lisac@tooelecity.org</u> or fax (435) 843-2119 and we will close your license. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Lisa with the Business Licensing Office at (435) 843-2110. Thank you!

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business Licensing Office at 435-843-2110 for more information.

ALL door-to-door salespersons (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2020 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a salesperson is not wearing a badge, call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give dispatch a description of the individual, along with the direction they are headed.



Keep Your Pipes Open To Avoid Freezing!

Every year when the weather turns cold the City sees a rash of reports of frozen pipes. The best thing that you can do to prevent this in your home is to keep the pipes open. Leaving a

slow drip or trickle in a faucet overnight, when the temperature and water usage is lowest, can prevent the water in your pipes from sitting still and freezing. As the weather gets colder over a longer stretch of time, the ground freezes deeper and deeper and puts more homes at risk of frozen pipes every day. Yes, the slow drip or trickle may end up costing you a little extra on your water bill, but that amount will always be drastically less than the cost to repair frozen pipes in your home and the water damage it can cause. 
