Time is moving so quickly and winter seems to be nearly over. Spring will be here before we know it! Many exciting things are happening at City Hall and throughout the City!

Budget discussions have begun and I will work with the staff and the City Council to present a tentative balanced budget in May. Meeting the needs of residents and providing the required services is always challenging when working within financial restraints. have planned to present my State of the City Address at the City Council meeting on Wednesday, February 19th at 7pm.

The new Tooele City Police

Station is scheduled to be completed within the next 2 months and a tentative ribbon cutting ceremony is scheduled for April 6th. The public will be invited to tour the new building at that time. I know that our residents will be impressed with the building and the fact that we are still under budget.

Several Parks Department projects are beginning soon and will include a sidewalk around the entire perimeter of Elton Park which will be a great place to walk. Additional pickleball courts and lighting will also be installed at Elton Park. New playground equipment will be replacing the old equipment at Parkers Park. Upgrades to irrigation systems will be installed at several parks. A plan will be presented soon to the City Council for the England Acres park. Also, new carpet will be installed at the Library where more than 250,000 visits are made each year.

We are moving forward with our #TakePrideTooele Spring Clean Up again this year in April and May. A list of community projects will be posted on our website soon. Again, I would

like to encourage residents to participate by cleaning up their own yards and neighborhoods or sign up as families, businesses, or groups to do projects in our community. More information will be available in the coming months. We will again be offering an extra bulk waste day to residents in May, so watch the newsletter to take advantage of that service. Thank you for helping make our City beautiful!

It is a pleasure to work with the City Council and staff as we plan and carryout the needs of the City. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our employees for their commitment to their jobs. Customer service is important to us and we pledge to provide great service to you!

Security Tips from the Tooele City Police Department



The Tooele City Police Department would like to remind you of some very important security tips:

Remember to keep your personal belongings and valuables out of view in your vehicles. It is also important to keep vehicle windows closed and doors locked. Often, stolen items are left in plain sight within the vehicle making them a prime target for thieves. There have been several reports of unlocked vehicles being targeted, rummaged through and items stolen. Some of the items have been used later to commit other crimes, such as Identity Theft and Fraud.

Commonly, vehicles that are stolen have been left to idle in a driveway or garage. Remember, never leave your car running and unattended, even to warm it up in the morning. Never leave your keys in the car and always park in a well-lit area, when possible.

Finally, don't hesitate to report suspicious activity. If you see a suspicious person who appears to be looking in vehicles, or loitering in a neighborhood or parking lot for no legitimate reason, call dispatch at 435-882-5600.

CENSUS DAY IS APRIL 1, 2020

Beginning in mid-March, people will receive a notice in the mail to complete the 2020 Census. For the first time ever, the U.S. Census Bureau will accept

responses online, but you can still respond by

phone or mail if you prefer. You can begin

completing your census as early as March 12, 2020.

In May, the U.S. Census Bureau will begin

following up in person with households that haven't

responded to the census. Completing the census is

required! It is a way to participate in our democracy and say, "I COUNT!" The Census impacts our

departments, schools, roads and highways - the

census results help determine how billions of dollars

in federal funding flow into states and communities

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS:

Those who have not paid their Commercial Business License Renewal Fee: A 50% LATE FEE will be implemented on February 1, 2020. You will have until March 1, 2020 to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. If we have not heard from you, your license will be considered inactive and we will CLOSE your business after March 15, 2020. You can mail in your payment, you can drop your payment off in the Finance Department OR in the drop box located south of City Hall (please write on the envelope "for business license renewal" and include your business license number). The Finance Department is not able to take payments over the phone. If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing <u>lisac@tooelecity.org</u> and we will close your license. If you have questions, please contact the Business License Specialist at (435) 843-2110. Thank you!

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call (435) 843-2110 for more info.

ALL door-to-door salespersons (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2020 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If salespersons are not wearing badges, please call (435) 843-2110 or Dispatch (after 5 p.m. and on weekends) at (435) 882-5600. Please be sure to give Dispatch a complete description of the individual and the direction they are headed. Thank you!

Animal Licenses

It is now Animal License Renewal time for 2020. Please renew your license by February 28th or your license fee will double as of March 1st.

All dogs and cats within Tooele City limits and over the age of four months must be licensed each year. The license renewal application must be accompanied by a current rabies vaccination certificate. License renewal fees may be paid at Tooele City Hall (90 North Main Street, Tooele) in the Finance Department. If you have any questions, please contact the Finance Department at (435) 843-2150.

Renewal Fees:

Female/Male Dog - \$20.00

Neutered or spayed dog - \$10.00 (Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation.)

Female/Male Cat - 10.00

Spayed or Neutered Cat - \$5.00 (Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation).
