



Please Help Us Serve You Better By Doing The Following:

Put your cans out by 6:30 a.m.
Place cans 3 feet apart
Do not overload cans
Do not place cans directly against the curb (when the cans are being set down, if they hit the curb it damages the wheels).
Promptly pull in your cans after they have been dumped—this helps our snowplow drivers to remove snow more efficiently from your street.
On windy days, please take care to ensure there is no loose garbage that may blow away and litter the streets.

We appreciate your efforts to help us maintain a safe, clean, and beautiful city!







City ordinance prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. from November 1 st

through March 31st. Please help city snowplow drivers by not parking on the streets and keeping things like basketball hoops off the streets! Thanks!

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS: Those who have not paid their Commercial Business License Renewal fee: A 50% LATE FEE will be implemented on Feb. 1, 2020. You will have until March 1,2020 to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. You can mail in your payment, drop your payment off in the Finance Department OR in the drop box to the south of City Hall. PLEASE indicate on the envelope for payment that it is a business license renewal AND your business license number. The Finance Department is <u>not able to</u> <u>take payments over the phone</u>. If you are no longer in business please let us know in writing by e-mailing <u>lisac@tooelecity.org</u> and we will be happy to close your license. BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED in Tooele City:

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business Licensing Office at (435) 843-2110 for more information.

ALL door-to-door sales persons (Itinerant/ Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2020 YELLOW Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a sales person is not wearing a badge, call the Business Licensing Office at 435-843-2110 or call Dispatch (after 5:00 p.m. & on weekends) at 435-882-5600. Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual and the direction they are headed. THANKS!



PRIMARY RESIDENTIAL EXEMPTION

Don't forget! SB13 requires the County Assessor's Office to have the Primary Residential Exemption state form on file in order for homeowners to continue receiving the residential exemption on their primary residence. Everyone needs to fill out this form or your primary residential exemption may be removed. Don't delay submitting your form—there is a 30 day deadline!

Animal Licenses

It is now Animal License Renewal time for 2020. Please renew your license by February 28th or your license fee will double as of March 1st.

All dogs and cats within Tooele City limits and over the age of four months must be licensed each year. The license renewal application must be accompanied by a current rabies vaccination certificate. License renewal fees may be paid at Tooele City Hall (90 North Main Street, Tooele) in the Finance Department. If you have any questions, please contact the Finance Department at (435) 843-2150.

Renewal Fees:

Female/Male Dog - \$20.00 Neutered or spayed dog - \$10.00 (Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation.)

Female/Male Cat - 10.00 Spayed or Neutered Cat - \$5.00 (Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation).

HEAT PROGRAM Utah Community Action

The HEAT Program helps families in low-income households pay their bills during the coldest months of the year. Applications open annually from November 1st to April 30th. There are also programs that offer crisis assistance year round. If you need help with your heating costs, apply today at utahca.org.

Curbside Recycling is available for Tooele City residential customers who have a utility account with Tooele City. You may opt-in to this service at any time. United States CENSUS DAY IS APRIL 1, 2020 Beginning in mid-March, people will receive a notice in the mail to complete the 2020 Census. For the first time ever, the U.S. Census Bureau will accept responses online,

but you can still respond by phone or mail if you prefer. In May, the U.S. Census Bureau will begin following up in person with households that haven't responded to the census.

Completing the census is required. It is a way to participate in our democracy and say, "I COUNT!" The Census impacts our ability to plan for the next decade. Your response matters! Health clinics, fire departments, schools, roads and highways — the census results help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into states and communities each year. Make sure you complete your census to ensure that we count everyone once, only once, and in the right place.

Friendly reminder of snow removal.

Section 4-11-15 of Tooele City code states: (1) it is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, with 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming. (2) It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic. Sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in roadway or other portions of sidewalks.
