Thank you to the public safety officers and



WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Information about the June Primary Election

As with everything else, the June Primary is an event in motion. Let me bring you up to date on some of the changes passed by the Legislature in their special session.

- There will be no Early Voting for this election.
- There will be no In-Person polling locations.
- On Election Day only, there will be a mobile polling location – by appointment only – at the County Building. Call 435-843-3155 for an appointment. Appointments will be for the disabled, for those who did not receive a ballot, and for emergencies only.
- Because State Conventions have not taken place yet, we do not know which political parties will have elections. That information will be advertised mid-May.
- Unaffiliated voters who want to vote in this election will have to affiliate or designate a party ballot 11 days before the election, as there will be no affiliating or requesting on election day.
- The Republican Primary Election will be closed except to those who are affiliated with the Republican party or who do so. The Democratic Primary Election will be closed except to those affiliated with the Democratic party and unaffiliated voters who request a Democratic ballot.

We are living in difficult times. The Clerk's office will do everything we can to help you vote, but we must follow the law. Please be patient with us as we will be with you. Be safe!

The 2020 Census is easier to take than ever before. For the first time, it can be done in minutes online including on your phone. The census can also be completed easily by phone or mail. However you decide to complete it, be sure to be counted. You matter. Your information is required by law and your information is protected.

- 3. Send questionnaire by mail

The census plays a part in every day for Utahns from education and roads to healthcare and politics. The outcome of the census can determine electoral representation down to the local level, including school boards and city councils. Infrastructure decisions and funding, from road repairs to transit development, use information based on census counts. Public safety uses these numbers to guide decisions about service areas, fire stations, police precincts and hospitals. At the request of many of our residents over many years, we are excited that we have finally been able to replace the fence around the cemetery! We anticipate that the new fence will be complete by Memorial Day.

CEMETERY MEMORIAL DAY DECORATIONS

Memorial Day decorations will be allowed to be placed on the grass outside of the concrete border/lawn mower strip four (4) days prior and five (5) days after Memorial Day. A complete clean-up of the Cemetery will take place beginning the Monday following Memorial Day and allowing one week for entire clean-up. Vases and/or trinkets made of glass, porcelain, or pottery will not be allowed in the cemetery and cannot be glued to monuments or markers. No wire, nails, hangers, steel rods, tent stakes, etc. will be allowed to secure decorations to the ground. Thank you for your help in keeping our cemetery beautiful and clean.

Tooele City Historical Preservation Commission

Tooele City is looking for someone with a demonstrated interest, compliance or knowledge in historical preservation to serve on the Tooele City Historical Preservation Commission. This is a volunteer position. Residents of Tooele City are invited to apply for nomination.

Accepted nominees will be appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council. Preference will be given to those who have degrees or are professionally trained as historians, architects, architectural historians, or archaeologists.

Responsibilities of Members of the Historical Preservation Commission may include:

- Survey and Inventory of community historic resources;
- Review proposed nominations to the National Register of Historic Places;
- Provide advice and information to public officials regarding identification and protection of local historic and archeological resources;
- Work toward the continuing education of citizens regarding historic preservation and Tooele City's history, and;
- ★ Enforcement of state historical preservation laws.


- □ Cut back overgrowth (bushes, vines, trees, shrubbery).

RESIDENTIAL BULK WASTE PICK UP

BOX IT! BAG IT! BUNDLE IT!



Some Do's and Don'ts

For this type of pickup it is required to BAG, BUNDLE, or BOX your items. Your boxes, bundles, and bags cannot weigh more than 75 lbs. Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is marked "FREE" or "PLEASE TAKE" or "GIVING AWAY". Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is leaning against fences or mailboxes. Do not park cars or other vehicles in front of your bulk waste or it may not be picked up. We ask you to set out your bulk waste the way you would want to pick it up.

DO put yard waste, appliances (freon must be removed), furniture, or large items that won't fit in your regular garbage can out for bulk waste pickup. DO NOT put construction debris, dirt, sod, rocks, household garbage, or hazardous waste our for bulk waste pickup.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When does Bulk Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulk waste pickup program year-round. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those items which do not fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our City and keeping it clean. This May you will get an extra bulk waste pick up day. See the schedule on this page.

Will Bulk Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulk Waste accepts old appliances (items must have freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulk waste pickup?

Yes! Bulk Waste will take your yard waste, such as branches, limbs, and shrubbery but it MUST be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine), and branches and limbs must be less than 4 inches in diameter and be less than 5 feet in length. Items cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulk Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulk waste.

Residential customers: The Bulk Waste Program is offered year round! Take advantage of your extra bulk waste pick up day during May - at no additional cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulk waste pickup, but not more than 24 hours prior. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup. If by chance your bulk waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reason they were unable to pick up your items. For a complete list of acceptable & unacceptable items, and specific requirements, please visit our website tooelecity.org. *Please note-bulk waste pick up is delayed by one day during the week of Memorial Day.
