Spring is just around the corner and it seems as though we are beginning to see an end to the pandemic! We have received additional snowfall last month that has helped with our water needs. We will be sending out information through this newsletter, Ninety North Main, each month on how to conserve our water usage. We will also be sharing information through our social media sites and website.

Although we have not received all of the snowfall we would have hoped for, our snowplows have been out to plow when needed. It seems as though we are still seeing that many residents are not complying with the new ordinance to address parking on the street during a snowstorm. The city council changed the code several months ago to allow overnight parking on the street during the winter months as long as it wasn't snowing; making the code less restrictive than the previous code.

The City Council establishes the laws of our city to protect our citizens. It is my responsibility to enforce those laws. Our police officers are also responsible to enforce the law. During the past several weeks, we have received many complaints from residents that their neighbors are breaking our parking laws. We have a responsibility to cite those individuals who are breaking the law. We then receive complaints from citizens who receive the citations. Can you see the situation we are in? Anger from citizens who want us to enforce the law and anger from those who are asked to comply with the law.

Parking citations are not a "money maker" for the city. It costs us more than the fine to process the paperwork, collect the fees, and file more paperwork for those who appeal. The city does not want to "make money" from parking fines. We just want our residents to comply with the law. I am asking that citizens be respectful of their neighbors. Keep your cars on your own property as much as possible. We understand the need to park on the street as needed; but not during a snowstorm or as a place to "store" a vehicle, recreational vehicle, or trailer when not in use.

It's the time of year when we start seeing warmer weather and more daylight. It means more people will be out on the streets and it is also a time of year where small crimes, like theft and graffiti, usually increase. Here are some important tips to remember with the seasons' changes:

1- Keep parked vehicles locked and remove valuables from the vehicle when you are not in it.

2- Remember that the curfew ordinance in Tooele City is as follows: a. It is an infraction for anyone 17 years of age or younger to be in or on a sidewalk, street, or alley or in any public place between

12:00 am and 5:00 am unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. b. All city-owned public parks shall be closed to all persons between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am unless otherwise signed. All city-owned skating facilities shall be closed to all persons between the hours of 10:00 pm and 6:00 am unless otherwise signed.

3- Keep bicycles, scooters, and other toys/equipment secured in a garage or fenced area.

4- Report graffiti/vandalism/suspicious activity immediately to Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600

ATTENTION <u>ALL</u> TOOELE CITY ONLINE UTILITY PAYMENT CUSTOMERS! Deadline Extended!

Tooele City is switching our utility online payment/bill pay software. <u>All</u> online customers who are currently paying their utility bill through Xpress Bill Pay must switch their utility account to our new Municipal Online Payments system.

To setup your new account:

- 1. Go to https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut.
- 2. In the top, right hand corner select Login/Register.
- 3. On the Login screen select Register.
- 4. Enter in your Email, Password and Name. Phone Number is optional. Select **Register** when done.
- 5. An email will be sent to your email address to confirm that your address is correct. Check your email to find the "Thanks for registering!" email.
- 6. Click the link in the email to confirm your email address and activate your account. The link returns you to the login page for your online services website.
- 7. Login using your email address and password.
- 8. Click on the link to Add to My Services.
- 9. Click on the link for **Utility Billing**.
- Click on Add Account. Note: You will be prompted to input your Account Number and Last Payment Amount.

You will also want to **disable autopay and remove your account from Xpress Bill Pay** (this is to ensure that you do not receive duplicate statements from both Municipal and Xpress Bill Pay during the transition. To do this, login in to your Xpress Bill Pay account and from the top menu select >>Autopay then select >>Disable (this is a toggle button to turn off autopay). Then from the top menu again select >> Accounts then select >> Remove Account. Logout of Xpress Bill Pay.

All online payment accounts must be switched over to the Municipal system by May 1, 2021.

If you pay your utility bill through your financial institution's Bill Pay option, you do not need to do anything. This change only impacts our current Xpress Bill Pay customers.

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS:

For those who have not renewed their Business License for 2021: FINAL NOTICES were mailed out in March, letting you know that you have not renewed your license and that your business was placed in an "inactive" (CLOSED) status; therefore, YOU SHOULD NOT BE DOING BUSINESS. If you have questions, please contact the Business Licensing Office at (435) 843-2110 or e-mail lisac@tooelecity.org.

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, must have a Tooele City Business License! Call the Tooele City Business Licensing Office at (435) 843-2110 for more information. Also, ALL door-to-door salespersons (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2021 PINK Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If salespersons are not wearing badges, please call (435) 843-2110 or Dispatch at (435) 882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a description of the individual(s) and the direction they were headed. Thank you!



Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code 8-6-13 states "All building sewers,

including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code 9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the Meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Public Works Department at 435-843-2132.



Trees are the ANSWER, but can also be the PROBLEM. Trees can hurt individuals, and can also contribute to vehicle damage. It is important to trim trees that hang out into the street. A

height of 12 feet 6 inches is required for vehicles to pass under. On a sidewalk, a height of 8 feet is necessary for individuals to walk underneath. Spring is an excellent time for home owners to check trees and ensure there are no problems for others. If you have any questions, please feel free to call our Public Works office at 435-843-2132.

Ideas to Clean Up & Beautify Your Yard

- Sweep sidewalks, curbs, and gutters.
- Mow, pull or spray weeds*.
- Clear away fallen limbs, branches, and leaves.
- Cut back overgrowth (bushes, vines, trees, shrubbery".
- Clear your yard from trash, debris, and clutter.
- Clean up and re-edge flower beds and borders.
- Great time to prep lawns for spring growth (rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed).
- Mow grass and redefine borders of the lawn.
- Neaten up hardscape surfaces (sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, porches).
- Clear obstruction (trees, vines, bushes) from sidewalks and roads.
- Patch, replace, or paint worn fences and gates.
- Add a final touch! Plant flowers and plants to add color, beauty and fun to your home!

*Section 8-4 1(a) of Tooele City code states any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owner is responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acers must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Violation of this code may result in fines and/or a class B misdemeanor.



Ideas to Clean Up Your Neighborhood

- Offer assistance to someone in your neighborhood who could use a little help or are unable to clean up their own property.
- Organize a neighborhood group to clean up common areas, double frontages, roadways, alleyways, and nature areas.
- Clean up sidewalks and gutters in front of vacant lots.

Frequently Asked Questions

When does Bulk Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulk waste pickup program yearround. The pick up day is once a month (Based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those times which do not fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our City and keeping it clean. This May you will get an extra bulk waste pick up day. See the schedule below.

Will Bulk Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulk Waste accepts old appliances (items must have Freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulk waste pickup?

Yes! Bulk Waste will take your yard waste, such as branches, limbs, and shrubbery but it MUST be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine), and branches and limbs must be less than 4 inches in diameter and be less than 5 feet in length. Items cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulk Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulk waste. The Hazardous Waste Collection Day has been postponed. Please visit tooelehealth.org for updated information.

Residential customers: The Bulk Waste Program is offered year round! Take advantage of your extra bulk waste pick up day during May—at no additional cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulk waste pickup, but not more than 24 hours prior. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup. If by chance your bulk waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reason they were unable to pick up your items. For a complete list of acceptable & unacceptable items, and specific requirements, please visit our website tooelecity.org.

Some Do's & Don'ts

For this type of pickup it requires to BAG, BUNDLE, or BOX your items. Your boxes, bundles, and bags cannot weigh more than 75 lbs. Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is marked "FREE" or "PLEASE TAKE" or "GIVING AWAY". Bulk waste will not pick up anything that is leaning against fences or mailboxes. Do not park cars or other vehicles in front of your bulk waste or it may not be picked up. We ask you to set out your bulk waste the way <u>you</u> would want to pick it up.
