City Offices will be closed on Monday, July 5th in observance of Independence Day. Garbage will not be collected on that day. Services will be delayed one day starting with the holiday. City Offices will also be closed on Friday, July 23rd in observance of Pioneer Day. Garbage will still be collected on that day.

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces vour water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses — such as newly planted sod or lawn — contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Thank you for your help in conserving water, a precious resource.

Due to the ongoing drought and extremely dry conditions, fire authorities and city officials are urging extreme caution this year when handling fireworks. Each year, the Tooele City Fire Department publishes a Fireworks Restrictions Map. This year's map is posted below and can also be found online at www.tooelefire.org. We are encouraging our residents to enjoy the City's fireworks show on Friday, July 2nd instead of lighting their own fireworks. Professional shows are much safer and more controllable than personal fireworks, which is why city officials

are urging residents to leave the fireworks to the pros this year. If you choose to light your own fireworks, we encourage you not to light fireworks that leave the ground. We urge our residents to be extra careful, especially this year, and always use common sense. Please be safe!

If you choose to light fireworks and live in an area where fireworks are not allowed, you may go to the Dow James Park (438 W. 400 N., Tooele) to light your fireworks. Please use the designated dumpsters and clean up your mess. By order of the Tooele City Fire Chief—Fireworks are not allowed to be discharged in any other Tooele City Parks. Please be safe!

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under

6 inches in height. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches in height.

We also encourage residents if you SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING! We are experiencing an increase in vandalism and graffiti in our parks. Please help us out and if you SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING! We spend thousands of tax payer dollars each year to repair vandalism and clean up graffiti. This past month we have had to close many of the restrooms at the parks due to vandalism

and damage, leaving the restrooms unusable for the public. Water valves have been manually turned on and water has been left running for hours. Please help us try to stop this and if you see suspicious behavior, call dispatch immediately at 435-882-5600.

STREET SWEEPER! Our new street sweeper is expected to arrive in the early part of July! The City hasn't had a functioning street sweeper for a very long time. This purchase was approved in the FY21 Budget and we ordered our new street sweeper last fallwe've waited a long time for it to be built and for its arrival-and we are anxious for it to get here! We have drivers lined up and ready and we will have it operating most days throughout the

ing Guide to Jun 24, 2621 During drought, little changes make a big difference! Here's one action we can all take to do our part: Water Less!



It takes approximately 3,000 gallons of water each time you water the average quarter-acre yard. The goal during extreme drought conditions isn't lush landscapes but rather "survival watering" to keep high-value plants alive like trees and shrubs. Grass is resilient and can survive with as little as 1" of water a month. It won't be green and will enter dormancy during times of drought and high temperatures but will recover when conditions improve.
