We will hold a flag ceremony in Tooele City at approximately 6:46 a.m. on Saturday, September 11th at the City Hall Complex located behind City Hall at approximately 50 North Garden Street. Please join us on that morning and also during the day as we perform acts of service in our community. The day will close with an event at the Utah Motorsports Campus which will include emergency responder informational booths, a short program, and fireworks. THE COUNCIL'S CORNER

Mark your calendars—the first day of fall in 2021 is Wednesday, September 22nd, but that is not the only first! Our "Ninety North Main" publication has added a first with a new article called "The Council's Corner!" The Council's Corner is a place where you can learn more about what is happening in your local government.

First, I will explain the role of the City Council. The City Council is the legislative body of Tooele City. The members of the Council hold the legislative powers and the policymaking powers. Legislative power is the authority to make laws, but not to enforce them or appoint the people charged with the duty to enforce. That is the role of the executive function and responsibility of the Mayor. Individual members of the Council have the right to vote as a member of the Council. The Council, acting as a group, has the right to set policy for the City and adopt the budget of the City. Municipal power is exercised by the legislative body through passage of ordinances and resolutions.

A tool that is used by the City Council is the General Plan which was recently updated in 2020. The General Plan is a guiding document that provides a clear vision for the City Council, City decision makers, residents, and others regarding the future development and physical form of the City. This includes several elements that, taken together, provide a guide for decision making regarding growth and development issues that will enhance the life of Tooele residents and businesses. The General Plan includes a Land Use Element; Affordable Housing Plan Element; Annexation Policy Plan Element; Transportation Element; Economic Vitality Element; and Parks, Open Space and Recreation Element. A copy of the General Plan is available on our website tooelecity.org.

Tooele City recently adopted a Drinking Water System Master Plan in May 2021. The master plan is a study of the City's drinking water system and customer water use. Some of the topics addressed are growth projections, source requirements, storage requirements, distribution system requirements, water rights requirements, and energy efficiency recommendations. The results of the study are based on the best data available and will be updated every 5-10 years or as new information becomes available. The vision of the City Council is to maintain a residential community and employment destination designed to enhance quality of life and ensure long-term prosperity!

There have been and will be a lot of firsts in 2021! The Tooele City Council has welcomed many new businesses that will provide first of its kind employment, such as Carvana and Plastic Ingenuity into our Industrial Depot as well as many more new businesses! We had the first ground breaking on the Deseret Peak Utah Temple! In the future we will have the first ground breaking on the new Deseret Peak High School! So, let's cheer for our dedicated City Staff and volunteers in our community that serve the residents of Tooele City! We can all celebrate the first day of school starting, the first football, volleyball, cross country running, golf, tennis, cheerleading, swimming and many more first games of the season! The first leaves on the trees that will change color from green to vibrant hues of red, orange, and gold! We can all be the first to cheer for our hometown, Tooele City!

#TakePrideTooele FALL CLEAN UP

TRASH/DEBRIS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City Code states these will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **YEAR ROUND BULK WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website tooelecity.org. Here are a few basic checklist items:

- ❑ You do not have to schedule a Bulk Waste Pick Up, just put your items on your curb the day before your pick up date. Please do not put items on the curb more than 24 hours in advance.
- ❑ Bulk Waste **MUST** be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine).
- ❑ Tree branches must be cut to less than 5 feet in length and can be no larger than 4 inches in diameter.
- ❑ Bulk Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- ❑ Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulk Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.
- ❑ Call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 if you have questions.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

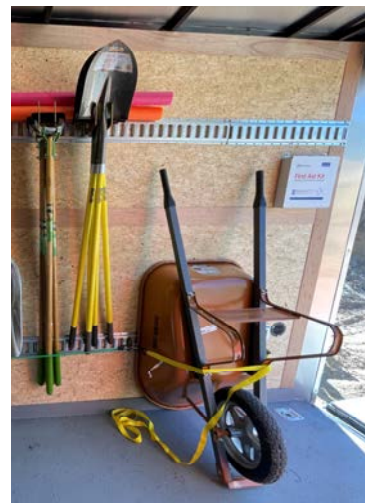

As the temperatures start to cool down don't forget to adjust the timer on your automatic irrigation / sprinkler systems. Lawns and gardens do not need as much water in the Fall as they do in the Summer. Shorter watering intervals conserves water for all of us and saves you money!
