Every time you spend money in Tooele City you are contributing to the Parks, Arts, & Recreation (PAR) funding that is used to fund cultural facilities, cultural organizations, and recreational facilities in Tooele City.

Tooele City voters first authorized the Tooele City PAR in the November 2004 election and reauthorized the funding in the November 2012 elections. Voters will be given the opportunity to reauthorize the 1/10th of 1% sales tax on the November 8, 2022 ballot. The amount of tax collected is equivalent to one penny for every \$10 spent.

OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

The above schedule is a voluntary outdoor watering guide for Tooele City residents. As you are aware, the Western United States is in a historic drought. Now more than ever water conservation is so important! At this time Tooele City is not implementing mandatory restrictions, but we ask our residents to follow the voluntary schedule and take steps on their own to conserve water. We will continue to monitor the situation daily.



Find water conservation tips and resources on our website tooelecity.org. There are great resources available to educate residents on how to save water both indoors and outdoors. We will also post tips and resources weekly on our social media sites so follow us on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. We share the weekly watering guide from the State of Utah's Department of Natural Resources on our social media sites, which takes into account current temperatures and precipitation to recommend weekly watering intervals. Tooele City Water Consumption Rate Schedule

The Tooele City rate schedule for water consumption promotes conservation for our customers. Water is billed monthly on an increasing rate schedule (provided below).

Water Charges - The water bill charge is a combination of two fees on your monthly billing:

1. Base fee dependent upon meter size.

<u>Size</u>	Base Fee
3/4"	\$10.00
1"	\$15.00
1½"	\$22.50
2"	\$30.00
3"	\$37.50
4"-6"	\$45.00

2. Water usage fee per unit (One unit of water equals 100 cubic feet or approx. 750 gallons).

<u>Usage</u>	<u>Per Unit</u>
0-10 units	\$0.75 per unit
11-30 units	\$1.00 per unit
31-50 units	\$1.25 per unit
51-70 units	\$1.50 per unit
71-90 units	\$1.75 per unit
91 + units	\$2.00 per unit

BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED IN TOOELE CITY:

Anyone offering a SERVICE from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License. Please call the Tooele City Business License Specialist at 435-843-2110 for more information or go to tooelecity.org and choose DEPARTMENTS>BUSINESS LICENSING from the menu for business info in Tooele City limits.

INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2022 GREEN Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and

maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.org. You may also contact the Tooele City Code Enforcement Officer at 435-843-2164 if you have questions or for more information.



Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code 8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code 9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main

line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? Check with your homeowners insurance to inquire if your policy covers these types of repairs. There are private companies who offer this type of insurance coverage if your homeowners insurance does not. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130.

UPDATE DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION

An updated Tooele City Water Quality Report is now available on our website at the following link: http://tooelecity.org/city-departments/ public-works/water-department/water-quality-reports/. The report that is available online is an updated version from the copy that was mailed to all water utility account holders within the City in July. Copies are also available at Tooele City Hall. If you have any questions, please contact the Public Works Dept. at 435-843-2130.

We are pleased to inform you that your drinking water continues to meet all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State drinking water health standards.

Tooele City Vigilantly Safeguards its Water Supplies by:

- Establishing drinking water source protection zones for each of the City's sources;
- · Adopting City Ordinances and relying on County Ordinances which regulate potential hazards to the City's drinking water sources; and,
- Collecting and analyzing water quality data to evaluate watershed protection efforts.

How You Can Help:

- •Read and follow usage guide-lines on detergents, fertilizers and pesticides;
- · Do your part to prevent runoff into the storm drain system;
- · Properly dispose of household products such as cleaners, oil or gasoline and unused medicines;
- · Continue your water conservation efforts; and,
- When you notice someone else contaminating the water, remind them that "We all live downstream.'



HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE TARGET PROGRAM

The HEAT Program will be offering a Cooling Program benefit for a limited time beginning April 1, 2022. Historically, HEAT eligible clients are only able to receive one utility assistance benefit per program year (October 1-September 30). This year, there was additional funding that allowed a second round of benefits for HEAT eligible households. Clients may apply for a HEAT Program benefit between October 1, 2021—March 31, 2022 AND a Cooling Program benefit between April 1, 2022—September 30, 2022. The Cooling Program benefit includes all of the same utilities as the HEAT Program (electricity, gas, propane, wood, coal, oil, etc.).

In addition to the HEAT and Cooling Program, there is also a Water Assistance to HEAT eligible households for a limited time. From October 1, 2021—March 31, 2022, clients were only able to receive Water Assistance if they were in danger of having their water shut off or were already without water. Beginning April 1, 2022, ALL HEAT eligible households will be able to apply for Water Assistance regardless of their water account status.
