As I have mentioned before, I am very excited about the re-launch of the Tooele City Downtown Alliance. Great things have been happening, and I am excited to talk to you about some of them. On Saturday, May 14th, the Tooele Downtown Alliance had its first event. It was a huge success and we saw many citizens out enjoying the downtown area. It was the 1st Annual Tooele Downtown Fest. We featured 7 professional chalk artists at Veterans Park and it was a juried show with prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. We also had a huge car show at the Tooele County Building with over 45 entries and prizes for the top three. On the lawn we had many vendors that set up to sell items. Thousands of Tooele residents came out and supported the event. The big win was for local businesses in the downtown area who saw a huge increase in foot traffic. This was a big boost to those who planned and pulled off this event. Afterwards there were talks about planning another event toward the end of summer.

We have more exciting news. The Downtown Alliance had their shipment of 10 life-sized buffalo delivered to the Tooele Valley Museum. Our goal is to adopt them to local businesses and citizens to design and paint before placing them for the term of one year. Once placed this will draw people downtown to take photos to share on social media as well as foot traffic to take in the artwork. This will be an incredible way for the Tooele Downtown Alliance to fund many of the events in the future. We would like to thank Mayor Winn and the Tooele City Arts Council for supporting the funding for the initial purchase of the buffalo.

Tooele City Economic Development Director Jared Stewart, Tooele City Downtown Alliance Chair Tyson Hamilton, and Tooele City Councilwoman Maresa Manzione attended a conference by Main Street America in Virginia to learn new ways to improve our Historic Downtown, and support the businesses in that area. They were able to tour the area and see other successful ideas instituted in these areas which have been effective. Many new ideas were formed and these Tooele representatives are excited to share with the rest of the Downtown Alliance what they learned.

I am so excited to see things moving forward in the great City of Tooele. I am grateful for those who serve in this capacity to better where we live. Tooele is moving in the right direction and I am so thrilled to rub shoulders with these amazing people. TOOELE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT— ANNUAL BANQUET

The Tooele City Police Department held their annual banquet this past April. We would like to acknowledge each one of our officers and express our appreciation to them for the work they do everyday to keep our community safe. There were several officers and citizens who received individual awards at the banquet that we would like to recognize:

♦ Professional Achievement Award: Officer N. Deeben

"In recognition of outstanding service in DUI Enforcement." 13 DUI Arrests (deployed active military for 3 months).

Professional Achievement Award: Officer C. Coon

"In recognition of outstanding service to the Department and community through patrol enforcement." Most Details/Cases - 1,611. Most Arrests - 127. Traffic Enforcement - 220 Citations/ Warnings.

Professional Achievement Award: Detective B. Dalton

"In recognition of outstanding service to the Department and community through investigative techniques/efforts." Assigned and closed the most cases in the shortest amount of time.

Citizen's Certificate of Appreciation: Christopher Elting

"On January 7, 2022, Officer Coon was in pursuit of a stolen vehicle in which the suspect evaded him, and the pursuit was terminated. A short while later, Mr. Christopher Elting flagged Officer Coon down and reported the suspect vehicle driving erratically into his apartment complex. This led Officer Coon to locate the vehicle, which was unoccupied. Mr. Elting then came back and reported to Officer Coon a description of the suspect and his location after which Officer Coon made the arrest. Mr. Elting's assistance led to the quick capture and arrest of a vehicle pursuit suspect which, without his crucial input, would have demanded many more man-hours to solve. Mr. Elting has assisted Tooele City officers in many instances and is always willing to go above and beyond. He is a benefit to the Department and to the Tooele City community."

Citizen's Certificate of Appreciation: Michael Feuerbach

"On April 14, 2021, officers were dispatched to a medical assist in which Dispatch advised that the female victim had been struck by her own vehicle as it rolled backwards, catching her with the door and dragging her into the road. Mr. Feuerbach witnessed the accident and quickly rendered aid to Ms. Ortega by using a floor jack to elevate the vehicle and ensure that Ms. Ortega was not trapped. Mr. Feuerbach's quick action prevented Ms. Ortega from sustaining further injuries and potentially saved her life."

♦ Life Saving Medal: Officer A. Banna

"On 8/30/2021, Officer Banna was called to a domestic in which a male crashed through a window slicing his upper arm. The male was unresponsive and bleeding severely. Officer Banna applied a tourniquet to the victim's upper arm and assisted paramedics with CPR when he stopped breathing and no longer had a pulse. The victim started breathing and was rushed to the hospital where he ultimately survived his wounds. The victim is alive today due to the actions of Officer Banna."

♦ Award of Excellence: Sergeant S. Sagers

"Over the past year, Sgt. Sagers has built an amazing team and networking opportunities with community partners at the Tooele County Health Department and other local police agencies. Sgt. Sagers has spent numerous hours working on building the Alcohol Task Force into an exceptional asset not just for the Tooele City Police Department, but also for community members across the county. The Alcohol Task Force is well organized and effectively runs day-to-day operations without

any issues. Sgt. Sagers and his team recently received the Law Enforcement Prevention Partnership Award from the Utah Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health for exceptional community and coalition support. Sgt. Sagers' hard work and dedication to community partnerships has brought distinction and honor to the Department."

♦ Medal of Valor: Corporal J. Stallings

"In the early morning hours, a woman called 911 because a man was intoxicated in the home and threatening while in possession of a gun. The suspect was located inside his garage pointing a shotgun at responding officers. Lethal force was used in defense of the officers and others. The suspect was wounded, still armed with a shotgun, defiant, and retreated into the home where the victim and her child were still located. Corporal Stallings pursued the man into the home. The shotgun was fired in the direction of Corporal Stallings, damaging the door but missing him. Corporal Stallings was undeterred still disarming the suspect, detaining him, and then assisting with rendering aid to him. Corporal Stallings acted with outstanding bravery to protect the victims and his fellow officers."

NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s)

adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! Now more than ever water conservation is so important! At this time Tooele City is not implementing mandatory restrictions, but we ask our residents to follow the voluntary schedule and take steps on their own to conserve water. We will continue to monitor the situation daily.



Find water conservation tips and resources on our website tooelecity.org. There are great resources available to educate residents on how to save water both indoors and outdoors. We will also post tips and resources weekly on our social media sites so follow us on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. We share the weekly watering guide from the State of Utah's Department of Natural Resources on our social media sites, which takes into account current temperatures and precipitation to recommend weekly watering intervals. DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION

The Tooele City Water Quality Report is available for your review, and has been mailed to all water utility account holders within the City. The Report is also available on the City's web page at the following link: http://tooelecity.org/city-departments/public-works/water -department/water-quality-reports/

We are pleased to inform you that your drinking water continues to meet all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State drinking water health standards.

Tooele City Vigilantly Safeguards its Water Supplies by:

- Establishing drinking water source protection zones for each of the City's sources;
- · Adopting City Ordinances and relying on County Ordinances which regulate potential hazards to the City's drinking water sources; and,
- Collecting and analyzing water quality data to evaluate watershed protection efforts.

How You Can Help:

- Read and follow usage guide-lines on detergents, fertilizers and pesticides;
- Do your part to prevent runoff into the storm drain system;
- · Properly dispose of household products such as cleaners, oil or gasoline and unused medicines;
- · Continue your water conservation efforts; and,
- •When you notice someone else contaminating the water, remind them that "We all live downstream.

WORKFORCE SERVICES HOUSING & COMMUNITY HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE TARGET PROGRAM

HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE TARGET PROGRAM

The HEAT Program will be offering a Cooling Program benefit for a limited time beginning April 1, 2022. Historically, HEAT eligible clients are only able to receive one utility assistance benefit per program year (October 1-September 30). This year, there was additional funding that allowed a second round of benefits for HEAT eligible households. Clients may apply for a HEAT Program benefit between October 1, 2021-March 31, 2022 AND a Cooling Program benefit between April 1, 2022-Sept. 30, 2022. The Cooling Program benefit includes all of the same utilities as the HEAT Program (electricity, gas, propane, wood, coal, oil, etc.).

In addition to the HEAT and Cooling Program, there is also a Water Assistance to HEAT eligible households for a limited time. From October 1, 2021—March 31, 2022, clients were only able to receive Water Assistance if they were in danger of having their water shut off or were already without water. Beginning April 1, 2022, ALL HEAT eligible households will be able to apply for Water Assistance regardless of their water account status.
