MAYOR'S MESSAGE MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

On Wednesday, September 21, 2022, I had the opportunity to attend the Chamber of Commerce Luncheon sponsored by Tooele City and hosted by the Oquirrh Hills Golf Course. I gave an update on projects that have happened and are happening around the City. I want to share that same update with all of you.

OCTOBER 2022

Water Update:

We have recently built two new wells that we are working on adding to our water system.

• The Berra Well and a 1 million gallon reservoir

• The Red Del Papa Well. You will notice us connecting this well to the system soon as we run a waterline down First Street from the Well to 400 North.

Sewer Update:

- We have completed a Secondary Water Feasibility Study. This study is a recommendation on how we can use our secondary water and we are now in the planning stages of how to use secondary water as well as implementing a water conservation plan.
- We are building a new \$6.9 million Headworks Building at the Water Reclamation Facility. We will not need to bond for this project. We have saved for this project, and between our Impact Fees and our ARPA Funds we will be able to pay cash for this project. This will increase the capacity at the facility from 3.5 million gallons per day to 12 million gallons per day.

Road Projects:

- We have spent nearly \$1.9 million in our 2022 Roadway Reconstruction Projects. We slurry sealed and chip sealed many streets in town to enhance and extend the life of those roads. We rebuilt Sunset Avenue, Oak Hill Drive, Deer Hollow Drive, and Elk Meadow Loop. We are still finishing up chip seal work and several streets in the City will be chip sealed this fall (weather permitting), including 100 East. That project will include restriping bike lanes that have faded, but we will not be restriping the entire surface with the green paint.
- We are expanding a section of 7th Street between 500 and 600 North. This project will widen the road and make much needed utility improvements in the area. That project was approved at \$1,151,617.07.
- We opened 7th Street along the eastern perimeter of England Acres Park so now 7th Street connects all the way through to 1000 North. We are working on the next phase of England Acres Park which includes a new pavilion, parking lot, playground, dog park, and trail system on the eastern side of England Acres.
- We are good partners with Tooele County and together we are working with them on a Countywide trail system.
- We also have a great partnership with the Tooele County School District. We just secured a 3rd Quarter Sales Tax Grant through Tooele County to assist the school district with the costs to complete their portion of 2400 North and Berra Blvd. that will be adjacent to the new Deseret Peak High School. The grant was awarded for \$1.8 million.
- We slurry sealed and striped Skyline Drive in an effort to reduce speeding. The Police Department has also added extra enforcement to try and stop/reduce speeding throughout the City.

Fire Department:

- We've hired a full time Fire Chief. We will soon be hiring a full time Fire Marshall who will also serve as our Emergency Management Coordinator.
- We have made history! The Tooele City Volunteer Fire Department has welcomed its first female firefighter!
- We are in the planning stages now and can't wait to start building Station #3 which will be located at approximately 145 East 1000 North in order to better serve the north end of our City.

Building and Community Development:

Building has not slowed down in Tooele City! In August 2022, we issued a total of 127 Building Permits, which include: 26 Single Family Dwellings, 94 Residential Remodels, 1 New Commercial Building, and 6 Commercial Remodels. By the end of August, our total permits were 77% of all of last year, which puts us on track to exceed last year's totals. We are on pace to exceed 120% of the number of permits we issued last year. The numbers continue to climb! Our three inspectors and Building Official had 614 inspections in 23 working days of August.

The tax is 1/10th of 1% of sales tax, meaning if you purchased a \$10 meal, one cent would go toward the tax.

Looking forward, we hope that you and your family are able to come out to our annual Downtown Trick-or-Treat on Monday, October 31st from 4 pm until 7 pm.

Finally, our City Council meetings have recently changed from being broadcast on Facebook Live to YouTube and hope you can join us remotely as we continue to make decisions to guide our town. As a Council we are grateful to serve you and hope you reach out to us if you have questions, concerns, or ideas on how we can make our town better.

Proposition #6 - Tooele City Question 1

Shall Tooele City, Utah, reauthorize a .1% sales and use tax to fund cultural facilities, cultural organizations, and parks and recreational facilities in Tooele City?

Funding may be used for capital improvements and operations of publicly owned/operated amenities such as, but not limited to:

- Parks
- Playing Fields/Courts
- Trails
- Playgrounds
- Pavilions

Funding may be used to support municipal or non-profit organizations providing programs such as, but not limited to:

- Youth Groups
- Museums
- Theater Groups
- Festivals
- Fridays on Vine and other Concerts
- Art Classes/Workshops
- Arts Councils

PARKS, ARTS, AND RECREATION (PAR)

PAR is the Tooele City Parks, Arts, and Recreation program that develops and maintains cultural, artistic, and recreational opportunities in the city.

PAR is a 1/10th of 1% sales and use tax. This means if you purchase a \$10 pizza, only one penny goes towards PAR; or if you purchase \$100 worth of groceries, only 10 cents goes towards PAR!

PAR is not a property tax.

Tooele City citizens first voted to approve the Tooele City PAR tax in the November 2004 election and reauthorized the funding in the



election and reauthorized the funding in the November 2012 election. Although this measure was voter approved twice before, state law requires that It be voted upon again in 2022. On the November 8, 2022 ballot, Tooele City citizens will vote on whether or not the city should continue to collect the one-tenth of one percent sales and use tax that funds PAR. If voters approve the ballot item, PAR will continue to develop and maintain cultural, artistic and recreational opportunities in the city.

Every time someone spends money in Tooele City they are contributing to the Parks, Arts, and Recreation (PAR) funding.

Election day is November 8th. Ballots will be mailed out the week of October 17, 2022. The last day to register and still receive a mail ballot is October 28th. There will be early voting from 12:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Tooele County Clerk's Office on October 27th and 28th and on November 3rd and 4th. TRASH/DEBRIS:

Tooele Citv

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City Code states these will be deemed a nuisance if: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety. Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner!

Tooele City provides a **YEAR ROUND BULKY WASTE PICKUP PROGRAM** to help you dispose of items which do not normally fit into your trash container. The pick up day is once a month and there is no additional cost to use this program. You can find the pick up schedule and more information on our website **tooelecity.org.** Here are a few basic checklist items:

- You do not have to schedule a Bulky Waste Pick Up, just put your items on your curb the day before your pick up day. Please do not put items on the curb more than 24 hours in advance.
- Bulky Waste MUST be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine).
- □ Tree branches must be cut to less than 5 feet in length and can be no larger than 4 inches in diameter.
- □ Bulky Waste cannot exceed 75 lbs.
- Ensure that you do not have unacceptable Bulky Waste materials such as tires, rocks, dirt, sod, oils, paints, construction debris, or hazardous materials.
- □ Call ACE Disposal at 435-882-7009 if you have questions.

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) states that junked, wrecked, or inoperable vehicles may not be kept upon real property for longer than 72 hours. Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept upon real property if they are placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code.

Tree Maintenance


While trees and vegetation contribute to the beauty of our neighborhoods and community, they may also create unintended obstacles and hazards when not maintained properly. Trees that hang over the street or over the sidewalk can create nuisances and in some cases hazards. Please maintain the trees on your property, particularly the trees in the park strips, to make sure your trees are not creating some of these issues:

- Damage to vehicles, particularly large vehicles such as snowplows and garbage trucks;
- Injury to persons;
- Blocked mailboxes;
- Blocked sidewalks;

Fall Yard Cleanup Ideas

Fall is a perfect time to start thinking about getting your yard and trees ready for winter. The right preparation now will save you time and energy when spring rolls around!

- 1. Clean Out Debris-clean up leaves and weeds
- 2. Till the Vegetable Garden—after final harvest
- 3. Trim Rogue Branches—trim large or out of place branches
- 4. Clean Out the Gutters—clear leaves and debris from rain gutters
- 5. Dry Everything Out—drain water from hoses and irrigation lines
- 6. Aerate the Lawn—break up soil so nutrients reach the roots
- 7. Feed the Lawn—add a fall fertilizer
- 8. Rake and Mulch—rake up leaves so they don't suffocate the grass
- 9. Prune Trees and Shrubs-trim dead or overgrown branches
- 10. Give it One Last Mow-set mower to a low setting
- 11. Divide and Cut Back Perennials
- 12. Protect Cold-Sensitive Plants—add mulch to the base
- 13. Plant Bulbs, Shrubs, and Fall Annuals
- 14. Protect the Deck—weatherproof to protect from moisture
- 15. Clean Tools and Store—prevent rust on your gardening tools

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2022 GREEN Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



In August 2021, the Tooele City Council approved Ordinance 2021-09, which amended the civil penalty for parking violations during a snow event. The civil penalty is now the same as for all other parking violations: \$50 if paid within 15 days, and \$100 thereafter.

As a reminder, Tooele City Code 10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions reads:

1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:



(a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,

(b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.

Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code 8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the

wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code 9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box." Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate the citizens on this?
