As we move forward, it is imperative that we continue to work together to prevent such accidents and enhance the safety of our community. I am committed to supporting any measures that can help mitigate the risk of such incidents in the future. I met with UDOT in the days following this incident and we will continue working with UDOT, as we have done for many years, on an alternate route/bypass route.

Tooele City truly is a remarkable place to live because of you, our residents. I appreciate your support and I am grateful to serve as your Mayor. I hope each of you enjoy a wonderful holiday season with your friends and families.

THE COUNCIL’S CORNER

Congratulations to the newly elected City Council members. This is a great time of year! I hope everyone has a chance to attend at least one of the many local holiday events. Although our City is awesome all year round, it is always great to see the generous hearts and kind spirits this time of year. Thanks for your part in making our community the best place to live!

Each City Council member has assignments to committees or boards where we represent the City and are a liaison to the City for that group. One of my responsibilities is to the Redevelopment Agency of Tooele. The purpose of redevelopment agencies is to pursue economic development and business opportunities and create jobs. Economic development is very important in our community because it helps to increase the tax base which lessens the tax burden on residential homeowners. It also helps provide jobs for our residents who would not have to commute to the Wasatch Front if they worked locally. In addition, shopping locally leaves more sales tax dollars in the City. Tooele City’s current philosophy is that we do NOT offer property or sales tax incentives to new business. We can, as part of a redevelopment agency, offer other incentives such as infrastructure help with sewer and roads, impact fees, etc.

Tooele City currently has two designated redevelopment areas – The 1000 North & Main Street area and the Peterson Industrial Depot. We have a budget that comes from property tax that is used to improve infrastructure and other things to entice businesses to come to those areas. The Industrial Depot project area was established many years ago and the 1000 North retail area more recently.

The Industrial Depot area designation will soon expire, but over the last 20 years much has been done to redevelop this area after receiving it from the army. In the last 5 years alone, the assessed value of the area has nearly doubled. The latest business that broke ground in November is Central States Manufacturing, which is expected to be a \$25 million investment creating over 100 jobs with possible expansion in the next few years.

Founder’s Point on 1000 North has been slow but is still moving forward. They have been working with multiple entities such as UDOT and Utah Power to get everything ready for the buildings. The developer continues to negotiate contracts with retail businesses and has confirmed that both Ross and Chili’s will be in the development. Other businesses will be announced soon.

The redevelopment agency is also working on a Tooele Business Park located near the USU Tooele Campus. Leitner Poma, a company that develops ski lift equipment, has begun to build. We expect them to invest over \$30 million in their development and create 100 jobs.

Tooele City commits to being a business-friendly City; we realize the benefit of increased commercial growth to our residents. We have great things coming to Tooele!

Snow Event Parking Restrictions and Winter Weather Reminders



As a reminder, Tooele City code prohibits parking vehicles on the public right-of-way when snow is falling or has accumulated.

Tooele City Code 10-3-6 reads...

"10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions"

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:
 - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
 - (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City's snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this Section:
 - (a) emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
 - (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.

Do not park your vehicles on the street when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated. You may be ticketed.

The civil penalty for parking violations during a snow event is \$50 if paid within 15 days, and \$100 thereafter.

As the winter months approach we want to remind you that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. This is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: *"It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming."*

Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: *"It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic."* Please be courteous to your neighbors, do not blow leaves, snow or other debris into their yards. Thank you!

Please do not park your vehicles on the street (or on the park strip or the sidewalk—they are also the right-of-way) when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated. Streets need to be clear of vehicles, basketball hoops, and other obstructions for plows to safely and efficiently clear the streets. Trees should be trimmed to at least a 12'6" minimum so they do not obstruct or damage plows. Also, as a reminder, if your basketball hoop is on the park strip, please make sure the hoop itself doesn't hang over the street where it can get snagged on the snow plows.

SEMI-TRUCKS — Per Tooele City Code, semi-trucks, shall not park overnight on city streets other than designated truck routes. In section 10-2-7(3) the following are designated truck routes: "(a) SR-36 (Main Street); (b) SR-112; (c) Tooele Boulevard (1100 W. St.); (d) Droubay Road; (e) Pine Canyon Road; (f) other streets as designated by express written permission of the police chief..."

Emergency Vehicles

When dealing with emergency situations we commonly see drivers panic and over-react or react incorrectly when they see an emergency vehicle with lights and sirens approaching.

Here are some rules to remember:

1. You must yield the right of way.
2. Drive to the far right edge of the curb.
3. Clear the intersection.
4. You must STOP!

When you see an emergency vehicle approaching with lights and sirens, (if possible) pull your vehicle to the far right side of the roadway. If you can't pull right then leave room for the emergency vehicle to get by. If you are already stopped, stay put! Once the emergency vehicle has passed, be sure to re-enter the travel lane with caution. Always keep the intersection clear because you don't know which way the emergency vehicle will have to go. As curious as you may be, do not follow an emergency vehicle leaving a scene. If you come to an intersection blocked by emergency vehicles, slow down! Watch for directions given by police personnel on the scene and proceed as directed.

When approaching a stationary emergency vehicle, drivers need to reduce their speed, provide as much space as possible, and make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the authorized emergency vehicle. This is generally a bigger issue for emergency personnel than failing to yield the right of way. Emergency personnel are hit by vehicles almost every year in Utah. We would like to remind the public to slow down and change lanes to provide a safer work environment for our emergency personnel.



DOMINION ENERGY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE ON UTAH AVENUE

Dominion Energy is upgrading natural gas lines on Utah Avenue. Soil conditions and unanticipated issues have prolonged this project. Dominion Energy anticipates that the work will be completed by December 16, 2023. Until that time, you can expect Utah Avenue to be closed

intermittently from Main Street (SR36) to 50 West. Although this is not a Tooele City Public Works project, if you have questions you can call the Public Works Department at (435) 843-2130. Thank you for your patience as Dominion Energy completes this important utility project.

RECOGNIZING SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

The first rule of crime prevention is to always be alert. Anything that seems slightly out of place or occurs at an unusual time of day could be criminal activity.

Never attempt to apprehend a suspect or investigate a possible crime on your own. Call the police immediately. Do not worry about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove to be unfounded; law enforcement officers would rather investigate than be called when it is too late.

Time and accuracy are critical when reporting crime and suspicious events. Use 9-1-1 when reporting life threatening events or crimes in progress, and use (435) 882-5600 ext. 1 when reporting delayed events or crimes.

ATTENTION ALL TOOELE CITY BUSINESSES

BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS for 2024 should be arriving just after December 1, 2023.

Commercial Businesses — you can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall, leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall, or renew your license and make payments online at <https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut>. Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo. You have through the month of January to renew your license. On February 1, 2024 a 50% late fee will be assessed.

Home Occupation businesses — Your 2024 business license certificate should be arriving after December 15, 2023.

If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing businesslicense@tooelecity.gov. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the Business Licensing Office at (435) 843-2110. Thank you!

BUSINESS LICENSES REQUIRED IN TOOELE CITY: Anyone offering a service from their home, for compensation, requires a Tooele City Business License.
