MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

February is the time of year when the Tooele City administrative staff are working with the Council on the annual budget. A copy of the Fiscal Year 2023 budget book is available on our website tooelecity.org. I would encourage residents to take a look at the book so they can have a better understanding of how the finances are handled by municipal governments.

I will be meeting with the Council in February to begin the process of making decisions on basic budget information so that I can begin to prepare the draft budget. As the budget officer, I am required by state law to present the draft budget to the Council at the first regular City Council meeting in May. The Council will then have approximately six weeks to review the budget and make any changes. The final budget will then either be approved at the second meeting in June or begin a truth in taxation process if they choose to adjust the property tax rate. If that happens, the budget will be approved in August.

During the next three months, I will be working with the director of each department to discuss their needs for FY2024. Our budget cycle begins on July 1st and ends on June 30th of each year. The budget process takes many hours to discuss, determine, and then prioritize how we can more efficiently provide services. The costs in services and supplies continue to increase. The budget process is challenging, to say the least. My staff and I commit to using tax dollars wisely to provide the services that our residents expect.

THE COUNCIL’S CORNER

Whether you are a fan of snow or not, Tooele City has welcomed several recent winter storms bringing rain and snow to the valley. The water content in the snow will be very helpful this year in improving drought conditions. The New Year’s Day storm series brought us to 138% of the median snow level. This is cause for celebration! Here are a few other fun snow facts from this New Year’s Storm:

- Tooele City had 10 snowplows and salters out during the storm;
- The drivers used 604 tons of salt;
- Snowplow drivers plowed 2,698 miles during the two-day storm (Tooele City has 214 miles of roadway);
- Drivers worked 16 hours the first day (New Years Day—January 1, 2023) and 10 hours the second day to plow city streets (New Years Day Holiday Observed—January 2, 2023);
- The Police Department issued 117 snow parking tickets during the storm to cars parked on the street;
- The volunteer fire department responded to 16 calls the first five days of the year, many calls were for storm related issues;
- As of January 2, 2023, our water content was at 161%

I would like to thank our snowplow drivers for their work in clearing our roads so our residents could get to work and school. City snowplow trucks all have GPS technology installed and it is easy to see where they are, how fast they are driving, and how many miles they drive – it is very impressive that ten drivers can cover the entire city starting with major roads and routes to schools, and then moving through the neighborhoods.

Sometimes the plows cover a recently shoveled sidewalk or block a driveway with plowed snow. I heard several examples of neighbors helping each other out to re-shovel a sidewalk or unblock driveways.

I would like to thank residents who helped their neighbors to shovel sidewalks, mailboxes, and fire hydrants and clear downed branches that broke under the weight of the heavy snow. Serving each other truly strengthens our community!

I hope we continue to receive the much needed snow and water that our valley needs. I love Tooele and I am happy to serve. Please reach out if you have ideas to make our community better.

TREE CITY USA
An Arbor Day Foundation Program

We are pleased to announce that as of January 1, 2023, Tooele City is once again a Tree City USA designated City! The last time we were a Tree City was in 2014.

The Tree City USA program has been greening up cities and towns across America since 1976. This program is a great opportunity to celebrate the importance of an urban tree canopy and improve care of these vital city trees. It is a nationwide movement that provides the framework necessary for communities to manage and expand their public trees. More than 3,500 communities have made the commitment to becoming a Tree City USA.

To achieve Tree City USA status, Tooele City met the four required core standards of sound urban forestry management: (1) maintain a tree board or department, (2) have a community tree ordinance, (3) spend at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry, and (4) celebrate Arbor Day.

Congratulations Tooele City on achieving this designation!



SIDEWALK REPAIR MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM

Tooele City desires to work with property owners to replace damaged sidewalks for the safety of sidewalk patrons and for improved neighborhood appearance. Tooele City is offering a **Sidewalk Repair Matching Grant Program** in which Tooele City will retain a contractor and pay for City-approved sidewalk repair projects upon property owners paying a matching one-half of the cost of the projects.

Program implementation is subject to adequate funding, contractor availability, weather, project eligibility and approval, and other factors. Limited funds are available.

If you are interested in participating in the “50/50 Matching Grant Program” to repair the sidewalk that abuts your property, please submit an application or contact the Public Works Department at 435-843-2130 for more information. Applications are available on our website tooelecity.org.

This program began in 2022. To date, 31 property owners have participated in the 50/50 program and the City has matched nearly \$40,000 to repair sidewalks through this program. There are many others who have submitted applications to be considered for the program and we anticipate that many more sidewalks will be repaired throughout our community in 2023 through this program!

Snow Event Parking Restrictions and Winter Weather Reminders



Snow Event Parking Restrictions

Tooele City Code 10-3-6(1) states: “10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions”

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:
 - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
 - (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City’s snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this section:
 - (a) Emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
 - (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.

Do not park your vehicles on the street when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated.

Snow parking restrictions are being enforced! You may be ticketed if you are in violation of this ordinance.

There were 117 snow parking citations issued in just the first two days of January 2023 during the New Year’s Day snow storm!

Our officers are not able to get to every part of the City during a storm to watch for parking violations, so if you see a violation of this ordinance, please contact Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600.

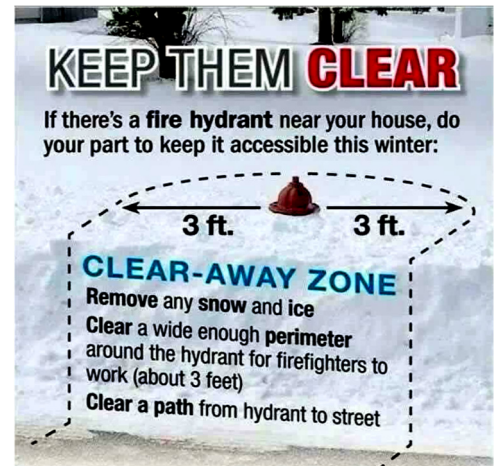
As the winter months approach we want to remind you that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. This is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: *“It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming.”*

When the snow falls, don’t let our students fall! Please keep all sidewalks that border your property clear, including the sidewalk in your backyard along the street (double frontage—see article below)! We need your help especially along school walking routes!

Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in a roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: *“It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic.”*

Please be courteous to your neighbors, do not blow leaves, snow or other debris into their yards.

YOU CAN REPORT CRIMES ONLINE THROUGH OUR ONLINE REPORTING TOOL!



The Tooele City Police Department offers an Online Reporting tool for citizens of Tooele City to report crimes that have occurred within Tooele City limits. If the crime happened outside of Tooele City limits, please call dispatch at 435-882-5600, option #1 so the appropriate agency can respond. If your crime happened within Tooele City and you would rather file your police report online instead of meeting with an officer, go to the Tooele City Police website <https://tooelecity.org/city-departments/police-department/> and click on the "Make a Report" link under the Quick Links Menu. Read the instructions fully to make sure your case is eligible for online reporting.

Online reporting is not for: Reporting emergencies, crimes in progress, violent crimes, or if you need to speak with an officer quickly. For emergencies, please dial 911, if you need to speak with an officer and it is not an emergency, please call dispatch at 435-882-5600, option #1. If you have questions about the online reporting system you can contact Sgt. Jason Potter at 435-882-5907, Monday through Friday 8 am to 5 pm.

Here is a list of crimes that are eligible to be filed online: Credit Card Fraud, Identity Theft, Fraud/Scam, Lost Property, Found Property, Retail Theft, Telephone Harassment, Vehicle Burglary, Illegal Dumping, Graffiti, Vandalism, Property Damage, Hit and Run (no known suspect), Vehicle Accident (if damage is less than \$2500), Mail/Package Theft, Theft of Services, Theft.

Upon completion of the online reporting process, you will be given a police report case number and you will be able to print a copy of the police report to keep for your records.

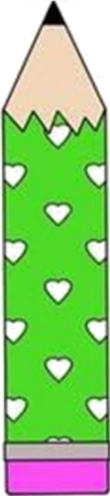
