individuals who truly care about serving the residents. This year we will continue to work together as a team to provide the services that our residents expect and deserve.



City Council meetings are generally held the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of every month at Tooele City Hall. Meetings are open to the public and are available through livestream on YouTube (Search "Tooele City Channel"). Meeting agendas, minutes, and video links for the meetings are available on our website tooelecity.org.

THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBITLIES OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL

Tooele City operates under a Mayor/Council form of government as determined by our City Charter and City Code. The Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer and the City Council is the Legislative Body. This system is modeled after the Federal Constitution structure of government. The Mayor and Council roles differ as they are separate yet equally important branches of the government, and together they work toward the well-being and betterment of our City. Here is a brief summary of the roles of each office:

MAYOR

The Mayor is elected by residents separately from the Council and serves a four-year term with no term limit. The position is nonpartisan, full-time, and paid.

The Mayor is the Chief Executive Officer and Administrative authority of the City which includes:

- ⇒ As the Budget Officer of the City, the Mayor proposes a tentative annual budget to the City Council;
- ⇒ Oversees that all laws, ordinances, and resolutions are faithfully executed;
- ⇒ Appoints City Department Directors;
- ⇒ Manages the day-to-day operations of the City. The Mayor supervises all departmental activities through the Department Directors and has responsibility over:
 - ♦ The Finance Department, City Attorney's Office, City Recorder's Office, Human Resources Department, Police Department, Fire Department, Community Development Department, Public Works Department, Parks and Recreation Department, Information Technology Department, Economic Development Department, City Hall, and other administrative departments as may be created or amended from time to time;
 - Included as part thereof, the Mayor has direct supervision of the construction, improvements, repairs, and maintenance of streets, sidewalks, alleys, sewers, drains, ditches, culverts, streams and water courses, gutters and curbs; of all public buildings, boulevards, parks, playgrounds, squares, and other grounds and facilities belonging to the City; and the collection and disposal of waste materials.
 - To care for and preserve all machinery, tools, appliances, facilities, and property belonging to the City.
 - To oversee the issuing of building permits, the inspection of buildings, plumbing, and wiring, subject to uniform codes adopted by the City.
 - To act as the purchasing agent for the City through an authorized designee, to see that city codes and purchasing policies are adhered to, to approve all claims against the City less the \$30,000, and to see that all goods purchased by and for the City are received as per contract.

The Mayor also functions as the Executive Director of Tooele City's Redevelopment Agency.

CITY COUNCIL

The City Council consists of five nonpartisan members elected at large by residents. Council Members serve four-year terms with no term limit, work for the City part-time, and are paid.

The City Council exercises the legislative powers of city government, including:

- ⇒ Adopt the annual City budget and appropriate funds;
- ⇒ Propose and adopt ordinances (laws) and resolutions;
- ⇒ Approve Mayoral appointments of City Department Directors;
- ⇒ Set appropriate tax levies, establish sewer and water rates, set other general tax and service
- ⇒ Approve all purchases and contracts that are greater than \$30,000; and,
- ⇒ Set the Council meeting agendas.

The Council also functions as the Board of Directors for Tooele City's Redevelopment Agency, the Municipal Building Authority, and the Tooele City Water Special Service District.

Snow Event Parking Restrictions and Winter Weather Reminders



Snow Event Parking Restrictions

Tooele City Code 10-3-6(1) states: "10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions"

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-of-way:
 - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
 - (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City's snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this Section:
 - (a) Emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
 - (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.

Do not park your vehicles on the street when snow is falling or when snow or ice have accumulated.

Snow parking restrictions are being enforced! You may be ticketed if you are in violation of this ordinance.

During the period of December 1 - 20, 2022, there were 54 snow parking citations issued.

Our officers are not able to get to every part of the City during a storm to watch for parking violations, so if you see a violation of this ordinance, please contact Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600.

Thank you for your help and cooperation!



As the winter months approach we want to remind you that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. This is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: "It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail

to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming."

When the snow falls, don't let our students fall! Please keep all sidewalks that border your property clear, including the sidewalk in your backyard along the street (double frontage—see article below)! We need your help especially along school walking routes!

Do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in a roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: "It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or

propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic."

Please be courteous to your neighbors, do not blow leaves, snow or other debris into their yards.

DOUBLE FRONTAGE LOTS — STREET/SIDEWALK ABUTS THE BACK OF THE PROPERTY

WHAT IS A DOUBLE FRONTAGE LOT?

A double frontage lot is defined as a lot that has primary frontage, the street in front of your property, and also has secondary frontage which is an additional street that abuts your property (Tooele City Code 7-19-7.1). This usually means that your lot has a street in the front and back of your property. If you have a double frontage lot, you are responsible to keep the sidewalk at the back of your property clean, in addition to the sidewalk in front of your property.

Please remember that Tooele City Code 4-11-19 requires that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of obstructions such as, but not limited to garbage, plants, leaves, dirt, and construction materials. Tooele City Code also requires that snow, hail, ice, and sleet be removed within 24 hours after a storm stops.

The responsibility to keep sidewalks clear also applies to sidewalks on corner lots as well as double frontage lots. If you have a corner lot, you are responsible to keep the sidewalk on the side of your property clean in addition to the sidewalk in front of your property.

Please help keep Tooele City safe and clean by making sure that your sidewalks are clear for pedestrian traffic. Thank you!





FROM THE TOOELE CITY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Our team members are always looking for ways to improve and better serve the residents of the City. One such member is Barbara Vargas in the Community Development Department. Barbara joined the City in December 2012 as a Clerk in the Community Development Department. She was promoted to the department Administrative Assistant in September 2017. With the retirement of the City's lone plans reviewer in January 2022, Barbara was again promoted to fill the role of Plans Examiner to review building permit plans submitted

to the City. This role requires several levels of certification in order to complete the reviews appropriately. These certifications each require study, practice, and testing of the regulations to demonstrate proficiency. In November, Barbara completed the first major tier of certifications and became fully certified for all residential permit reviews, including structural, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical. Barbara performed very well on all of these certifications. Completing these certifications in less than a year, especially while working and completing plan reviews at the same time, is a significant accomplishment. Tooele City recognizes and is very proud of Barbara Vargas for what she has accomplished so far and looks forward to what she continues to accomplish in service to the community!



Congratulations to Tooele City Council Member Tony Graf for receiving the Change Leader Certification!

A three day Change Leader Institute was held in June 2022 with a cohort of 12 people. Certification was awarded in November 2022 at the Change Leader Conference.

The Change Leader Program is a professional development course with an active network of course graduates. Participants attend a three-day immersive institute with instruction on assessing environments and the communication and facilitation skills necessary to implement change. Following the institute, Change Leaders practice these skills by completing a certification project. These certified Change Leaders form a network of leaders that share a common language, mentor each other, and convene through leadership circles and conferences.

To complete their training, Change Leaders design a project applying the concepts they learned in the Institute. After examining their environment to identify a need, they plan a response, engage others, identify resources, negotiate, honor resistance, adjust plans as necessary, and implement change.

Holiday Trash Pick up Schedule

Please watch our website and social media for the garbage collection schedule throughout the year. In January, garbage will be picked up on regular schedule the week of January 2 - January 6, 2023 (after the New Year's Day holiday). Garbage will not be picked up on Monday, January 16, 2023 in observance of the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. Garbage pick up will be delayed that week by one day beginning with the holiday.



Residents are encouraged to dispose of their Christmas trees by placing them at the curbside on their bulky waste pick up day. In addition to Christmas trees, other acceptable items include: old appliances, furniture, carpet, couches, and mattresses. All items must be bagged, boxed, or bundled. All boxes, bags, or bundles must weigh less than 75 lbs. Visit tooelecity.org for bulky waste guidelines. Please Help Us Serve You Better By Doing The Following:

• Put your cans out by 6:30 a.m. • Place cans 3 feet apart • Do not overload cans

• Do not place cans directly against the curb (when the cans are being set down, if they hit the curb it damages the wheels). • Promptly pull in your cans after they have been dumped—this helps our snowplow drivers to remove snow more efficiently from your street. • On windy days, please take care to ensure there is no loose garbage that may blow away and litter the streets.

Commercial Businesses — Commercial Business License Renewals for 2023 should have arrived just after December 1, 2022. Commercial businesses, you can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall, leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall, or renew your license and make payment online at https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut. Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo. You have through the month of January to renew your license. A 50% LATE FEE will be implemented on February 1, 2023. You will have until March 1,2023 to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. Keep Your Pipes Open To Avoid Freezing

Every year when the weather turns cold the City starts receiving a number of reports of frozen pipes. The best thing that you can do to prevent this in your

home is to keep the pipes open. Leaving a slow drip or trickle in a faucet overnight, when the temperature and water usage is lowest, can prevent the water in your pipes from sitting still and freezing. As the weather gets colder over a longer stretch of time, the ground freezes deeper and deeper and puts more homes at risk of frozen pipes every day. Yes, the slow drip or trickle may end up costing you a little extra on your water bill, but that amount will always be dramatically less than the cost to repair frozen pipes in your home and the water damage it can cause.
