

THE COUNCIL'S CORNER BY COUNCIL MEMBER MARESA MANZIONE

Hopefully many of you were able to attend the Downtown Fest and the Tooele City Arts Festival a few weeks ago. Supporting our local businesses and artists is very important. While downtown, please notice the five new parking spaces on the west side of Main Street near the corner of Vine Street! These spaces, along with the improvements to the curb and sidewalk on that corner will make the downtown business district more accessible. Tooele City and the Tooele City Downtown Alliance worked with UDOT to make this important change happen. This project was funded through the Tooele County 3rd Quarter Sales Tax grant.

Tooele City recently adopted improved landscape standards for new development that requires water conscious landscaping. I am excited that these ordinances will make Tooele City residents eligible for the State's "Flip your Strip" rebate program and help to conserve water. There are specific rules that need to be followed to be eligible, including photos that have to be submitted. If you are interested in flipping your strip please check out the website, utahwatersavers.com, before you start so that you are eligible for the rebate. The Jordan Water Conservancy website has some great ideas for water wise park strip plans – and the plans are free. Visit conservationgardenpark.org for ideas.

One of my council assignments is to serve on the Redevelopment Agency (RDA). The RDA is tasked with the economic redevelopment of specified areas within the City. Economic development is important to the City's tax base. One of the RDA areas is the Tooele Business Park. This is the land around the Community Learning Center and Tooele Technical College. Having these great educational institutions in our community has been invaluable to encourage industrial business growth because of the trained work force graduating and ready to go to work. We want to welcome Leitner-Poma of America to our business park. This is a \$35 million project and is expected to provide 236 new, high-paying jobs during the next ten years. Another of the RDA areas in Tooele is the Peterson/Ninigret Industrial Depot. This property was originally owned by the United States Army and when Tooele City took possession of the property in 1998 the taxable value was \$1.1 million. The current taxable value is \$454 million. Adding business development increases the value of this land and in turn increases the tax base of Tooele City. This means that the tax rate can be maintained at a lower rate for residential property owners than it would be otherwise. Tooele City will soon be welcoming another company to the Peterson Industrial Depot. Central State Manufacturing has just announced an expansion to Tooele! Central States is a \$25 million project and is expected to hire 90 people over the next five years. As we continue to attract and recruit these companies, we also provide jobs for our residents that do not require commuting to the Salt Lake Valley, and in turn, our residents shop in our community which keeps sales tax money here. As more people shop in the community, more retail businesses are interested in opening here. The result is a circle of benefit for Tooele City residents.

I am so happy to live and serve in such a great community! Hopefully we will see you at the upcoming 4th of July Celebration events!

INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2023 BLUE Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, please call 435-843-2110 or Dispatch at 435-882-5600 (after 5:00 p.m. and on weekends). Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual(s) and the direction they are headed. Thank you!

NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/ grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their

lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The civil penalties section of the Abatement of Nuisances code (8-4-7) was adopted at the City Council meeting on June 7, 2023. A new citation schedule is now in effect. The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.org. You may also contact the Ordinance Enforcement Division at 435-882-8900 with questions or for more info.

DRINKING WATER SOURCE PROTECTION

The Tooele City Water Quality Report is available for your review, and has been mailed to all water utility account holders within the City. The Report is also available on the City's web page at the http://tooelecity.org/services/public works/water/ following link: water quality reports.php

Public Works Project Updates

A lot is happening around Tooele City! In addition to managing the City's vehicle fleet, water, streets, sewer, and storm water systems on a daily basis, the following is a list of current and upcoming summer Public Works projects. If you have questions about these projects or any other projects you see happening in the City, please call the Tooele City Public Works Department at 435-843-2130. We appreciate your patience during this important work!

- 1220 South Roadwork (from SR36 to approximately 1010 West):
 - 1220 South is being rebuilt and a new waterline was put in prior to road work. This project is in progress and water services should be getting tied in soon. Asphalt will go in after utility work is complete.
- Lisa Way and Clifford Drive Roadwork:
 - \Rightarrow Lisa Way and Clifford Drive are both being rebuilt. Milling work was anticipated to start on June 26, 2023. Notices will go out to affected residents prior to work beginning.
- 7th Street Roadwork Widening (between 500 N to 600 N):
 - 7th Street is being widened between 500 North and 600 North. The project is currently in progress with continued utility re-location work (power and communication utilities). A new storm drain will be installed prior to the road expansion work.
 - This project is taking longer than anticipated due to unforeseen utility issues under the road.
- Vine Street Sidewalk:
 - This project is nearly complete. A new sidewalk was installed \Rightarrow at approximately 450 - 550 West Vine Street using UDOT Safe Routes to School grant funding.
- Main Street Parking:
 - This project added 5 new parking spaces to the west side of \Rightarrow Main Street at approximately 29 North Main Street. The project is nearly complete. Irrigation work still needs to be finished. This project was completed with Tooele County 3rd Quarter Sales Tax grant funding.
- Southwest Drive Storm Drain:
 - \Rightarrow Adding new storm drain on Southwest Drive will help mitigate flooding in this area.
- Roadwork Projects:
 - We anticipate that chip seal/slurry seal projects throughout town will be going out to bid soon. Affected residents will be notified prior to work beginning.
- Crews are painting fire hydrants and red curbs throughout town.
- Work continues on the Red Del Papa Well and the Berra Well and Reservoir. The Red Del Papa well is expected to be added to our water system soon.
- Iron Street Sewer:
 - \Rightarrow This rehab project is scheduled to begin at the Peterson Industrial Depot as we continue efforts to upgrade aging infrastructure with available budget.

Other projects of interest:

- UDOT is installing a traffic light at the 600 West 1000 North (State Road 112) intersection. A temporary signal will help with the current traffic situation at this very busy intersection. UDOT will continue working on the design of this intersection (it will most likely be widened) before installing a permanent traffic light.
- All West Communications is installing fiber communication lines throughout the City. All West is notifying residents when they are in the area. If you have questions about that project, please contact All West at 833-386-9498 or go online to https://info.allwest.com/tooele.

WHAT DO WE DO WITH ALL OF THESE SANDBAGS?

Tooele City and our residents did an amazing job this Spring with flood mitigation efforts! Residents filled over 18,000 sandbags in preparation for potential flooding. We are grateful Mother Nature cooperated with this year and we

did not experience flooding in Tooele City! Now that the risk of flooding from snowmelt has passed, the question comes, "what do I do with my sandbags?"

Sand or sandbags that have come into contact with only precipitation, but not floodwater, are normally considered to be not contaminated and can be reused without restriction. Potential reuses include flower beds or gardens, playgrounds or sandboxes, snow and ice control, or as base for paving blocks. If you typically have issues with flooding during the late summer monsoonal rainstorms, you can keep your sandbags to use during those storms this year.

Tooele City does plan to have disposal days this July. Watch our website, tooelecity org, or our social media sites @tooelecity for more information on days, times, and locations.

Do Not dump sandbags in creeks, rivers, canals, ditches, roadway gutters, or storm drain inlets. PLEASE DO NOT THROW SANDBAGS AWAY WITH YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE!



We encourage residents to enjoy the City's fireworks show on Saturday, July 1st instead of lighting their own fireworks. Professional shows are much safer and more controllable than personal

fireworks, which is why residents are encouraged to leave the fireworks to the pros. If residents choose to light their own fireworks, we urge you to be careful, and always use common sense. Please be safe! Please note: Fireworks are not allowed to be discharged in any Tooele City Parks. Thank you for your cooperation!
