MAYOR'S MESSAGE MAYOR DEBBIE WINN



Recognizing **Suspicious Activity**

The first rule of crime prevention is to always be alert. Anything that seems slightly out of place or occurs at an unusual time of day could be criminal activity.

- Never attempt to apprehend a suspect or investigate a possible crime on your own. Call the police immediately. Do not worry about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove to be unfounded; law enforcement officers would rather investigate than be called when it is too late.
- Time and accuracy are critical when reporting crime and suspicious events. Call 9-1-1 when reporting life threatening events or crimes in progress, and call 435-882-5600 ext. 1 when reporting delayed events or crimes.

HELP KEEP OUR PARKS BEAUTIFUL!

You can help keep our parks and playgrounds looking good by identifying and reporting problems.



Helping out is easy: 1. Visit tooelecity.org; 2. Click on the Parks and Recreation home page (found under City Departments); 3. Under the Quick Links Menu find the Parks & Facility Maintenance Request link or look for the icon; 4. Fill out the form and describe the problem or your suggestion; and, 5. Submit.

We encourage residents, if you SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING! We are experiencing an increase in vandalism in our parks. We spend thousands of tax payer dollars each year to repair vandalism and clean up graffiti. Please help us try to stop this and if you see suspicious behavior, call dispatch immediately at 435-882-5600. Tooele City offers a \$250 REWARD for information that leads to the arrest of the person(s) responsible for graffiti or vandalism. The above schedule is a voluntary outdoor watering guide for Tooele City residents. Even though we received near record snowfall this winter, water conservation is still just as important as ever! Although this schedule is not mandatory, we ask our residents to follow the voluntary schedule and take steps on their own to conserve water.



Find water conservation tips and resources on our website tooelecity.org. There are great resources available to educate residents on how to save water both indoors and outdoors. We will also post tips and resources weekly on our social media sites so follow us on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. For good watering practices you can also follow the weekly watering guide from the State of Utah's Department of Natural Resources, which takes into account current temperatures and precipitation to recommend weekly watering intervals. Find the guide at https://conservewater.utah.gov/weekly-lawn-watering-guide/.

Tooele City has been implementing water conservation and water wise practices. One practice we started last year is to leave the grass a little longer at our parks and facilities in an effort to conserve water. We are trying to do our part, and we ask that you please do yours!

INFO on DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS

ALL door-to-door solicitors (Itinerant/Transient Merchants) must be licensed with Tooele City and must have a 2023 BLUE Tooele City ID Badge on and in plain sight. If a solicitor is not wearing a badge, call Dispatch at 435-882-5600. Please be sure to give a complete description of the individual and the direction they are headed. Thank you!



NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/ grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their

lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecity.org. You may also contact the Tooele City Code Enforcement Officer at 435-843-2164 if you have questions or for more information.



Fireworks Restrictions 2023

As we approach Fireworks season, please keep in mind that there are safety restrictions in place—areas along the outer limits of Tooele City where fireworks are not allowed. A map with complete details is available online at tooelefire.org.

Lighting of fireworks is allowed July 2 — July 5 and July 22 — July 25 between the hours of 11 am and 11 pm. On July 4th and July 24th the hours are extended to midnight.
