MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our first responders around the County. We have had a lot of tragedy in our community recently.

In January, our first responders were called to Ensign Engineering where a car had crashed through the building and we lost Roseanne Davis in that terrible accident.

Earlier in February, a sweet 8 year old boy, Dallin Cunningham, passed away after falling off a slide at Rose Springs Elementary School in Stansbury Park.

And then, on the night of February 13th, our first responders were again called out, this time to the Settlement Canyon Reservoir on a rescue effort after teenage boys fell through the ice. Sadly one of those young men, Jayden Davis, did not survive.

My heartfelt and most sincere condolences go out to the families of those involved in each of these tragedies. We are grieving with them and we are heartbroken for them.

It is a difficult job to do, especially when the results are devastating and painful, so I would like to thank our heroes, especially those who aided in rescue efforts that Monday night at the reservoir: Tooele City Fire Department, Tooele City Police Department, Tooele County Sheriff's Office, Tooele County Search & Rescue, Mountain West Ambulance, AirMed, Department of Public Safety Star 8 Helicopter, Utah Highway Patrol, Department of Public Safety Dive Team, North Tooele Fire District, Tooele County Fire Department, Tooele County Dispatch, MCOT Mental Health, Tooele County Peer Support Team, and Christensen & Griffith Construction who provided specialized equipment, and to all others who gave support and aid.

Many of the first responders volunteer and give of their time, talents, and their own resources to help our community. They are true heroes. I am so grateful for the thousands of residents who do not hesitate to support the grieving family members when these terrible events take place. Many do not even know those who are suffering, but they look for ways to support and serve them. Many of you don't wait for a tragedy to strike. Your continual efforts to help and serve others in our community every day is so amazing. Thank you all for your example of service and love.

MARCH IS FLOOD AWARENESS MONTH

The potential for flooding could occur at any time. We have had a wet winter and we are above normal in snowpack and water content in our mountains this year. Sometimes, floods develop slowly and forecasters can anticipate where a flood will happen days or weeks before it occurs. Oftentimes, flash floods can occur within minutes and sometimes without any sign of rain. Being prepared can save your life and give you peace of mind. Here are some suggestions from the National Weather Service (<https://www.weather.gov/safety/flood-before>) to make sure you and your family and home are prepared:

CREATE A COMMUNICATIONS PLAN: It is important to be able to communicate with your family and friends in the event of a disaster. Whether it is having a specific person identified to contact for status updates or a safe location to meet up with family members, having a plan in place will give you peace of mind if disaster does strike.

ASSEMBLE AN EMERGENCY KIT: It is good practice to have enough food, water, and medicine on hand at all times to last you at least 3 days in the case of an emergency. Water service may be interrupted or unsafe to drink and food requiring little cooking and no refrigeration may be needed if electric power is interrupted. You should also have batteries, blankets, flashlights, first aid kits, rubber boots, rubber gloves, and a NOAA Weather Radio or other battery operated radios easily available.

KNOW YOUR RISK: Is your home, business or school in a floodplain? Where is water likely to collect on the roadways you most often travel? What is the fastest way to get to higher ground? Knowing the answers to these questions ahead of time can save your life.

SIGN UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS: Sign up for TooeleAlerts. See information below.

PREPARE YOUR HOME:

1. If you have access to sandbags or other materials, use them to protect your home from flood waters if you have sufficient time to do so. Filling sandbags can take more time than you may think. Tooele City provides a sand filling station at our Public Works shops located at approx. 1000 South Main Street, Tooele. Bags and sand are provided for residents to fill their own bags.
2. Have a professional install check-valves in plumbing to prevent flood waters from backing up into the drains of your home. Make sure your sump pump is working and consider having a backup. Make sure your electric circuit breakers, or fuses, are clearly marked for each area of your home.
3. Since standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding, ensure coverage by contacting your insurance company or agent to purchase flood insurance. This must be done before there is even a threat of flooding as insurance companies stop issuing policies if there is a threat of flooding. (i.e. an approaching hurricane). Many flood insurance policies take at least 30 days to go into effect so even if you can buy it as a storm is approaching, it may not protect your investment.

PREPARE YOUR FAMILY/PETS: You may be evacuated, so pack in advance. Don't wait until the last moment to gather the essentials for yourself, your family and/or your pets.

CHARGE YOUR ESSENTIAL ELECTRONICS: Make sure your cell phone and portable radios are all charged in case you lose power or need to evacuate. Also make sure you have back-up batteries on hand.

LEAVE: If it is likely your home will flood, don't wait to be ordered to leave; evacuate yourself! Make alternative plans for a place to stay. If you have pets, take them with you or make arrangements to board them at a facility well away from the flooding danger.

TOOELE **ALERT**

Tooele County is able to send you emergency alerts via text message, email, pager, or voice mail (in extreme cases), based on your preferences. It is important that we collect this contact information because many households no longer utilize traditional land-based telephone lines. Sign up at tcm.org today!

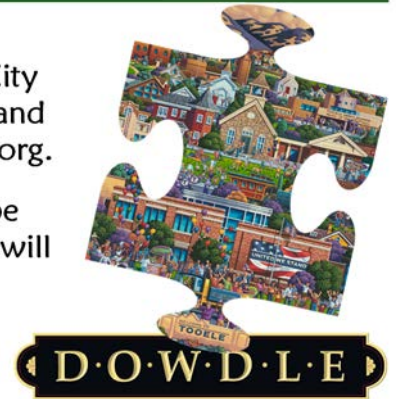

Fiber Optics Coming to Tooele! Groundbreaking Scheduled for March 7, 2023

Fiber optic internet is coming to Tooele, Utah, bringing high-speed internet, voice service and streaming TV to residents and businesses. Tooele joins several other communities in providing All West Communications fiber optic internet to the whole City.

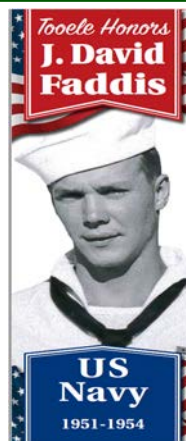

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS:

For those who have not renewed your COMMERCIAL Business License, a penalty fee of 50% was assessed starting February 1st. Please be sure to renew your license! You have until March 15, 2023 to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. If we have not heard from you, your license will be considered inactive and we will close your business after March 15, 2023. You can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Dept. at City Hall, leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall, or renew your license and make payment online at <https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut>.

Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo.
