MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

I know that flooding is on many of our minds! We have seen news reports of neighborhoods that are experiencing flooding from around the State. Floods are unpredictable and potential flooding from snow melt will be entirely dependent on the weather.

We want you to know that Tooele City is doing our part in flood mitigation to prepare in the case of flooding. We are being diligent and inspecting flood channels and waterways daily. Since the beginning of March, we have been monitoring the two canyons and residential areas of the City. City Staff have been covering several miles a day to make assessments of these areas, as well as cleaning ditches and culverts. At the time of this publication, water flows were in the beginning stages and we will continue monitoring closely.

In Tooele City, we are focused on two main areas: the Settlement Canyon drainage system and the Middle Canyon drainage system. City crews have spent significant time clearing small trees, debris, and trash from the Settlement Canyon drainage ditch, Middle Canyon Drainage (Devils Ditch), as well as north of England Acres and 1000 North. The valve at 700 South that feeds the Settlement Canyon Irrigation has been closed and any run off that spills over will be diverted down 700 South. Homeowners on 700 South are prepared with sandbags. Middle Canyon runoff will be diverted to Pine Canyon until they reach their capacity then the water will run down the Middle Canyon drainage North through the City. Settlement Canyon Reservoir has about 700 acre feet to fill before any spillover will occur. Levels will be monitored and assessed daily.

Daily, our crews will continue to mitigate the dead fall, debris, trash, and large trees from both the Middle Canyon drainage as well as the Settlement Canyon drainage. The culvert at Droubay & Smelter as well as the drainage system throughout the golf course will be cleared of debris, trash, and willows. Tooele City Staff will continue to monitor the weather patterns and flood channels in an effort to stay ahead of and mitigate any issues ahead of time. We will continue to fill sandbags to have on hand. I appreciate the hard-work that our staff and crews have already spent on mitigation efforts.

I thank you for doing your part in flood preparedness! To date, our residents have used 246 tons of sand to fill 15,200 sandbags! That is a lot of sandbags, and we will continue to provide sand and bags. Tooele City recently received an additional 20,000 bags from Tooele County. Sand and bags are still available at the following locations for you to fill your own:

- Dow James Park Parking Lot, 438 W 400 N
- Elton Park Parking Lot, 491 Birch St.
- Tooele County Location, 505 W 900 S
- Park and Ride Parking Lot, 2400 North SR-36

The most important thing for you to focus on is protecting your home. You can help by clearing gutters, drains, ditches, and other storm water systems near your property. If you have a drainage ditch on your property, we encourage you to clear the ditch of all debris, trash, and dead fall. Residents ask us where they should place sandbags. Place sandbags in areas to prevent water from entering your home – around window wells, exterior basement entrances, and low lying garages.

2023 ELECTION AND FILING PERIOD

Tooele City will hold a municipal election to elect three (3) City Council positions, all four-year terms. Given a sufficient number of candidates, a primary election will be held on August 15, 2023 with the municipal general election being held on November 7, 2023.

Qualifications for a candidate are: (1) Be a United States citizen; (2) Be at least 18 years old; (3) Be a registered voter of Tooele City; and (4) Be a resident of Tooele City for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the election.

Qualified candidates may file a [Declaration of Candidacy form](#) in person with the City Recorder at Tooele City Hall, 90 N. Main St., Tooele, Utah. **The filing period is from June 1, 2023 to June 7, 2023 during regular office hours and not later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of filing.** All candidates for election are subject to financial disclosure requirements.

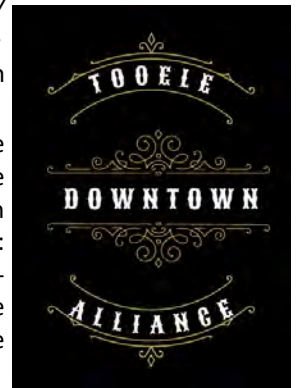

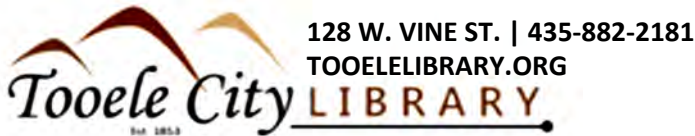

OUTDOOR WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses-such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 435-843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

The above schedule is a voluntary outdoor watering guide for Tooele City residents. Even though we received near record snowfall this winter, water conservation is still just as important as ever! Although this schedule is not mandatory, we ask our residents to follow the voluntary schedule and take steps on their own to conserve water.

The way our conservation schedule is designed allows tanks in different areas of the City to refill on the days when those areas are not watering. This helps our overall system by not pulling from all of our tanks at once. We appreciate your help!



Find water conservation tips and resources on our website tooelecity.org. There are great resources available to educate residents on how to save water both indoors and outdoors. We will also post tips and resources on our social media sites so follow us on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.

As part of Tooele City's conservation efforts we will be converting the cemetery irrigation system to water wise controllers. The Oquirrh Hills Golf Course has converted 12 acres of irrigated turf into native grass area. We are also installing filters on irrigation so that we can stay on secondary water more often, and we are now limiting non-recreated turf areas around detention basins. We are trying to do our part, and we ask that you please do yours! Thank you for your help!

CEMETERY MEMORIAL DAY DECORATIONS



Memorial Day decorations will be allowed to be placed on the grass outside of the concrete border/lawn mower strip four (4) days prior and six (6) days after Memorial Day. A complete clean-up of the Cemetery will take place beginning the Monday following Memorial Day and allowing one week for entire clean-up. Flowers in vases will be allowed to remain, all other decorations in the Cemetery will be discarded. Vases and/or trinkets made of glass, porcelain, or pottery will not be allowed in the cemetery and cannot be glued to monuments or markers. No wire, nails, hangers, steel rods, tent stakes, etc. will be allowed to secure decorations to the ground. Thank you for your help in keeping our cemetery beautiful and clean!

Ideas to Clean Up & Beautify Your Yard

- Sweep sidewalks, curbs, and gutters.
- Mow, pull, or spray weeds*.
- Clear away fallen limbs, branches, and leaves.
- Cut back overgrowth (bushes, vines, trees, shrubbery).
- Clear your yard from trash, debris, and clutter.
- Clean up and re-edge flower beds and borders.
- Great time to prep lawns for spring growth (rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed).
- Mow grass and redefine borders of the lawn.
- Neaten up hardscape surfaces (sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, porches).
- Clear obstruction (trees, vines, bushes) from sidewalks and roads.
- Patch, replace, or paint worn fences and gates.
- Add a final touch! Plant flowers and plants to add color, beauty, and fun to your home!

*Section 8-4 1(a) of Tooele City code states any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owner is responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Violation of this code may result in fines and/or a class B misdemeanor.



Ideas to Clean Up Your Neighborhood

- Offer assistance to someone in your neighborhood who could use a little help or are unable to clean up their own property.
- Organize a neighborhood group to clean up common areas, double frontages, roadways, alleyways, and nature areas.
- Clean up sidewalks and gutters in front of vacant lots.

Frequently Asked Questions

When does Bulky Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulky waste pickup program year-round. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those items which do not fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our City and keeping it clean. This May you will get an extra bulk waste pick up day. See the schedule.

Will Bulky Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulky Waste accepts old appliances (items must have Freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulky waste pickup?

Yes! Bulky Waste will take your yard waste, such as branches, limbs, and shrubbery but it **MUST** be bagged, boxed or bundled (with rope or twine), and branches and limbs must be less than 4 inches in diameter and be less than 5 feet in length. Items cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulky Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulky waste. Please visit tooelehealth.org for information about the Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, August 26, 2023.

Residential customers: The Bulky Waste Program is offered year round! Take advantage of your extra bulky waste pick up day during May—at no additional cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulky waste pickup, but not more than 24 hours prior. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup. If by chance your bulky waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reason they were unable to pick up your items. For a complete list of acceptable & unacceptable items, and specific requirements, please visit our website tooelecity.org.

Some Do's & Don'ts

For this type of pickup, it is required to **BAG, BUNDLE, or BOX** your items. Your boxes, bundles, and bags cannot weigh more than 75 lbs. Bulky waste will not pick up anything that is marked "FREE" or "PLEASE TAKE" or "GIVING AWAY". Bulky waste will not pick up anything that is leaning against fences or mailboxes. Do not park cars or other vehicles in front of your bulky waste or it may not be picked up. We ask you to set out your bulk waste the way you would want to pick it up.
