MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

Spring is just around the corner, which means road construction and improvements will begin soon!

Tooele City secured a \$2.1 Million grant to widen and improve Droubay Road between Vine Street and Smelter Road. This project will also include an 8-foot paved walking/biking trail on the east side of the road. This project will begin soon; unfortunately, that entire section of road will be closed during construction. It will be inconvenient for some, but it will be worth it when the project is completed by the end of the summer.

In addition to Droubay Road, we have many upcoming projects this spring/summer:

- Restriping projects will begin soon on several main roads.
- Chip seal and slurry seal is scheduled for many roads.
- A new traffic signal project is out for bid for the 1000 North and 100 East intersection.
- Flashing pedestrian signals (Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon Lights or RRFB's) are currently being installed at the intersection of 520 East (7th Street) and 1000 North (near England Acres Park), and also on Vine Street at approximately 400 West. These signals will allow pedestrians to push a button that will turn on flashing signals, notifying drivers that a pedestrian is in the crosswalk and that they should yield to the pedestrian.

Although we have many projects scheduled, what we cannot control are drivers' actions and choices. Drivers must be alert and follow traffic and safety laws. The photo below is the flashing pedestrian signal that was installed at 520 East 1000 North in mid-March. That new signal was up less than 4 hours when a driver hit the signal with their car, damaging the signal and a fence. Please pay attention when driving—for your safety and for the safety of all those sharing the road with you.



Speeding continues to be a problem, just like in every other city. Although many citations for speeding are issued, it has not made an impact on those driving well over the speed limit. Currently, I have ordered three traffic studies to be conducted on intersections near school zones that would allow the City to make those intersections four way stops if the intersections meet warrant criteria. Based on the results of these studies, we hope to be able to install more stop signs to slow down traffic and increase safety at these intersections.

Watch our website and upcoming newsletters to see where and when our projects will take place.

I appreciate your patience as we work to improve our roadways.

FROM THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT AT TOOEELE CITY

April Bills:

You may have noticed that we have not been out reading meters during the winter months. Each year the City estimates water usage for the winter months. This estimated usage is based upon the average water used at the location during the prior year (November-March). When we take the first reading of the year in the month of March, the consumption is then billed based off of actual usage. Customers will see a positive or negative consumption indicating that they are either being billed for unbilled water usage, or credited for unused units that have been billed for.

It is important to watch for high water consumption on your April billing as this can indicate a water leak during the winter months. Additionally, it will impact your next year's winter water average and your sewer average calculation (see below). If you notice an unusually high consumption, please call us and we can check the meter for leaks. Also, please be sure to report any leaks that have been repaired during these winter months to the Tooele City Finance Department for a partial credit to your account.

Sewer Rate Re-calculations:

Sewer charges are calculated every year and your new monthly charge appears on the April bill. The sewer charge is calculated based off of actual water used during the winter months from November through March.

The sewer billing is a combination of two fees:

Base fee of \$7.00 +

A Base fee of \$2.00 per unit of water averaged during the winter months (calculated November through March, which normally accounts for internal water use only).

If your rate has increased, some common things that can cause an increase in the charge is an increase of household members, working from home, outside watering after November 1, and leaks in the inside or outside of the home during the winter months. If you did experience a leak, please call our office.

Equal Pay Re-Calculations:

Customers currently enrolled in our equal pay program will have their equal pay amounts re-calculated on the April bill. Equal Pay is an average of what is actually used for the last 12 months of billing for all services billed. It is important to note that actual meter readings of winter usage and sewer rate changes reflected on the April billing will not impact this re-calculation as it will be for service from April 2023—March of 2024 billings.

It is very important for all equal pay customers to review their water usage monthly as this is the only way to quickly identify a possible leak or problem. If usage is not monitored it can take up to 12 months for this to show up in your billing, which not only costs money but wastes our precious resources. Please report any unusually high usage amounts to our office.

Droubay Road Closure

Construction is expected to begin mid-April 2024 on the Droubay Road Widening Project. Droubay Road will be widened between Vine Street and Smelter Road. Improvements will include road widening, curb, gutter, sidewalk, lighting, and a walking/biking path. In order to complete this project safely and in a timely manner, Droubay Road will be completely closed between Vine Street and Smelter Road for the duration of the project (we anticipate this project will be complete by the end of the Summer). Have you ever wondered who is responsible when your sewer lateral or water service line needs repair? City Code §8-6-13 states "All building sewers, including the connection to the POTW sewer, shall be maintained by the property owner". Property owners are responsible for their own sewer laterals up to the wye connection to the main sewer line. City Code §9-4-6 states "Tooele City shall maintain the service pipe from the main line to and including the water meter and other apparatus within the meter box". Property owners are responsible for their own water lines from the meter box connection into the property and structure. Did you know that Utah law requires the City to educate citizens on this? Check with your homeowners insurance to inquire if your policy covers these types of repairs. There are private companies who offer this type of insurance coverage if your homeowners insurance does not. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the Public Works Department at 435-843-2130.

Ideas to Clean Up & Beautify Your Yard

- Sweep sidewalks, curbs, and gutters.
- Mow, pull, or spray weeds*.
- Clear away fallen limbs, branches, and leaves.
- Cut back overgrowth (bushes, vines, trees, shrubbery).
- Clear your yard from trash, debris, and clutter.
- Clean up and re-edge flower beds and borders.
- Prep lawns for spring growth (rake, aerate, fertilize, and seed).
- Mow grass and redefine borders of the lawn.
- Neaten up hardscape surfaces (sidewalks, driveways, pathways, patios, porches).
- Clear obstruction (trees, vines, bushes) from sidewalks and roads.
- Patch, replace, or paint worn fences and gates.
- Plant flowers and plants to add color, beauty, and fun to your home!

*Section 8-4 1(a) of Tooele City code states any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owner is responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Violation of this code may result in fines and/or a class B misdemeanor.



Ideas to Clean Up Your Neighborhood

- Offer assistance to someone in your neighborhood who could use a little help or are unable to clean up their own property.
- Organize a neighborhood group to clean up common areas, double frontages, roadways, alleyways, and nature areas.
- Clean up sidewalks and gutters in front of vacant lots.
- Reserve the #TakePrideTooele Neighborhood Cleanup Trailer free of charge at tooelecity.gov for your neighborhood cleanup project.

Frequently Asked Questions

When does Bulky Waste Pick Up?

Tooele City provides a monthly bulky waste pickup program year-round. The pick up day is once a month (based on your normal garbage pickup day) for those items which do not fit into your trash container. This service is provided at no additional cost to Tooele City residents and will go a long way in cleaning up our City and keeping it clean. This May you will get an extra bulk waste pick up day. See the schedule.

Will Bulky Waste pick up old furniture and appliances?

Yes! Bulky Waste accepts old appliances (items must have Freon removed and a label placed indicating removal), mattresses, furniture, carpet, and couches.

Can I put yard waste out for bulky waste pickup?

Yes! Bulky Waste will take your yard waste such as: branches, limbs, and shrubbery, but it MUST be bagged, boxed, or bundled (with rope or twine), and branches and limbs must be less than 4 inches in diameter and be less than 5 feet in length. Items cannot exceed 75 lbs.

Will Bulky Waste accept hazardous waste?

No! Do not put items such as paint, solvents, batteries, or pesticides out to be picked up by bulky waste. Please visit tooelehealth.org for information about the Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, August 17, 2024, from 9 a.m.-12 Noon at the Deseret Peak Complex.

Residential customers: The Bulky Waste Program is offered year round! Take advantage of your extra bulky waste pick up day during May—at no additional cost to you! Please make sure everything is out on your curb before 7:00 a.m. the day of your bulky waste pickup but not more than 24 hours prior. There is no need to call Tooele City or ACE Disposal to schedule a pickup. If by chance your bulky waste pickup was missed on your pickup day, please call ACE Disposal directly at 435-882-7009. If your items are out of compliance, ACE Disposal will leave a tag on your door indicating the reason they were unable to pick up your items. For a complete list of acceptable & unacceptable items, and specific requirements, please visit our website tooelecity.gov.

Some Do's & Don'ts

For this type of pickup, it is required to BAG, BUNDLE, or BOX your items. Your boxes, bundles, and bags cannot weigh more than 75 lbs. Bulky waste will not pick up anything that is marked "FREE" or "PLEASE TAKE" or "GIVING AWAY". Bulky waste will not pick up anything that is leaning against fences or mailboxes. Do not park cars or other vehicles in front of your bulky waste or it may not be picked up. We ask you to set out your bulk waste the way you would want to pick it up.
