

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

MAYOR DEBBIE WINN

As we begin the new year, I am reminded of a recent event that I attended in Salt Lake City sponsored by the Utah League of Cities and Towns (ULCT). Governor Spencer Cox was the speaker at one of the presentations where he spoke about an initiative that he created called "Disagree Better." As the National Governors Association (NGA) Chair, Governor Cox worked with NGA Vice Chair, Colorado Governor Jared Polis, to encourage elected officials in our country to work together with respect. Governor Cox said.

"Americans need to disagree better. And by that we don't mean that we need to be nicer to each other, although that's helpful. We need to learn to disagree in a way that allows us to find solutions and solve problems instead of endlessly bickering.

We know that conflict resolution takes work and involves difficult conversations. It's much easier to sow division than to persuade or find solutions. But we also know that no one ever changed someone's mind by attacking them.

Through healthy conflict, we're confident that we can find common ground and improve our families, our communities, and our nation. Together, we can disagree better."

Also presented at the conference by the ULCT was this message:

"The Utah League of Cities and Towns engages based on three principles of respect, collaboration and outcomes. They strive to respect each other's roles and work together to achieve mutually beneficial outcomes. Treating each other with dignity and respect is critical so that we collectively tackle the challenging issues facing communities. As Utahns, our strength is based on our ability to work together, even when we have differing perspectives. As local leaders, we strive to set an example of not just civility, but dignity in all our interactions."

The message that government leaders should work together with respect and dignity, reminds me that the same should also apply to the residents we serve. It also applies to neighbors and others that we interact with on a daily basis.

We can "agree to disagree," but we need to do it respectfully. I have always been given good advice that as an elected official, I need to have a "thick skin." This has been difficult, not only for me, but also for my family. It is frustrating and disheartening when anger and passion take over and people would rather post misinformation on social media, rather than get the facts. I have always made myself available to meet and talk with anyone who wants to talk. I have found this to be very effective for both myself and the individual or group. Once we understand each other, we can make needed improvements and change what is needed to make our City better.

As the new year begins, I would hope that all residents make a determined effort to talk things out — with neighbors, family members, co-workers, and others to make our small part of the world a place of peace and understanding.

THE COUNCIL'S CORNER

On January 12, the Council, Mayor, and several department heads met to discuss the 2024-2025 budget. This is the first of several budget meetings the Council will hold prior to the approval of the final budget. We discussed many topics, including our budget goals and challenges impacting Tooele City. The group discussed potential options for an early pay off for about \$5.1 million in bonds issued in 2012 and 2015. This would save Tooele City an estimated \$640,000 in interest and free up the current payments to be used for other vital needs in our community. During the last several years, Tooele City has significantly reduced our long-term debt through prudent planning.

One challenge discussed during the meeting was the aging water reclamation plant (sewer plant). The facility is over 20 years old and will need significant improvements and upsizing over the next several years. Construction began in 2023 on the new \$6.9 million headwork building that will increase the capacity from 3.4 million gallons per day up to 12 million gallons per day. This project was funded by proceeds from the American Rescue Plan Act, impact fees, and sewer enterprise funds. We did not have to bond to complete this project. This one building is a small portion of the improvements needed at the water reclamation plant. We will be discussing options to fund additional water reclamation projects in our future meetings. We encourage residents to reach out with any questions and to attend our council meetings held on the first and third Wednesday of each month. SIDEWALK REPAIR MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM

Tooele City desires to work with property owners to replace damaged sidewalks for the safety of sidewalk patrons and for improved neighborhood appearance. Tooele City is offering a **Sidewalk Repair Matching Grant Program** in which Tooele City will retain a contractor and pay for City-approved sidewalk repair projects upon property owners paying a matching one-half of the cost of the projects.

Program implementation is subject to adequate funding, contractor availability, weather, project eligibility and approval, and other factors. Limited funds are available.

If you are interested in participating in the "50/50 Matching Grant Program" to repair the sidewalk that abuts your property, please submit an application or contact the Public Works Department at 435-843-2130 for more information. Applications are available on our website tooelecity.gov.

This program began in 2022. To date, nearly 50 property owners have participated in the 50/50 program and the City has matched over \$60,000 to repair sidewalks through this program. There are many others who have submitted applications to be considered, and we anticipate that many more sidewalks will be repaired throughout our community in 2024.

Snow Event Parking Restrictions and Winter Weather Reminders



Snow Event Parking Restrictions

Tooele City Code 10-3-6(1) states: "10-3-6. Snow Event Parking Restrictions"

- (1) It shall be unlawful to park a vehicle on any public right-ofway:
 - (a) when snow is falling upon that vehicle; or,
 - (b) when snow or ice have accumulated in any amount on the right-of-way upon which that vehicle is parked.
- (2) Any vehicle parked in violation of this Section may be removed at the discretion of the Tooele City Police Department for creating public safety risks and for obstructing the City's snow removal efforts.
- (3) The following are exempt from this section:
 - (a) Emergency vehicles and personnel in the performance of their functions and duties; and,
 - (b) Tooele City public works vehicles and employees in the performance of their functions and duties.

<u>Do not park your vehicles on the street when snow is</u> falling or when snow or ice have accumulated.

Snow parking restrictions are being enforced! You may be ticketed if you are in violation of this ordinance.

Our officers are not able to get to every part of the City during a storm to watch for parking violations— if you see a violation of this ordinance, please contact Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600.

Thank you for your help and cooperation!



During the winter months, we want to remind you that residential and business sidewalks must be cleared of snow, hail, ice, and sleet within 24 hours after a storm stops. This is especially important in areas that are school walking routes! Tooele City Code 4-11-15(1) states: "It is unlawful for any person owning or exercising control over any real property abutting any public sidewalk to fail to remove or cause to be removed from such sidewalk

all hail, snow, or sleet falling thereon, or ice forming thereon, within 24 hours after such hail, snow, or sleet has ceased falling or ice has ceased forming."

When the snow falls, don't let our students fall! Please keep all sidewalks that border your property clear, including the sidewalks along your back or side yards adjacent to the street (double frontage)! We need your help especially along school walking routes!

Please do not place or propel snow, hail, ice and sleet in a roadway or other portions of sidewalks. Tooele City Code 4-11-15(2) states: "It is unlawful for any person to place or propel, or cause to be placed or propelled, snow, ice, hail, or sleet in the public way or in any manner which poses a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic."

Please be courteous to your neighbors; do not blow leaves, snow, or other debris into their yards. We encourage neighbors to help their neighbors shovel their driveways and sidewalks, especially for those who are unable to remove the snow themselves. Thank you!

PLEASE KEEP PLASTIC BAGS OUT OF YOUR RECYCLING BIN!

Plastic bags do not belong in the recycle bin.

Plastic bags, wraps, and films can't be recycled in your curbside recycling bins. When plastic goes through the sorting equipment at the recycle facility it can bind up and damage the machines. You can take some of these items to local retail stores where they collect plastic grocery bags for recycling.

GARBAGE CAN FEE INCREASE

Attention Tooele City Customers:

Effective February 1, 2024, Tooele City will implement the newly adopted fees for garbage can service of \$13/month for a first can, and \$6.50/month for any additional cans. After a comprehensive external study of the garbage removal and disposal costs it has been determined this fee increase is necessary in order to keep up with increased costs of the monthly garbage service provided to

residents. This rate will be reflected on the bill dated February 26, 2024.

Customers who need to have any additional cans picked up may do so by calling 435-843-2150, by emailing a request to utilities@tooelecity.gov, or in our office at 90 N. Main St., Tooele. The first can fee is a required service for all residential utility customers.

Animal Licenses

It is now Animal License Renewal time for 2024. Please renew your animal license by Feb. 28, 2024.

License fees double on March 1, 2024.

All dogs and cats within Tooele City limits and over the age of four months must be licensed each year. The license renewal application must be accompanied by a current rabies vaccination certificate. License renewal fees may be paid at Tooele City Hall (90 North Main Street, Tooele) in the Finance Department. If you have any questions, please contact the Finance Dept. at (435) 843-2150.

- Unsterilized Dogs: \$35.00

*Must indicate on Rabies Certificate animal is neutered or spayed or have supporting documentation.

TOOELE UTAH

The Tooele City Police Department offers an Online Reporting tool for citizens of Tooele City to report crimes that have occurred within Tooele City limits. If the crime happened outside of Tooele City limits, please call Tooele County Dispatch at 435-882-5600, option #1 so the appropriate agency can respond. If your crime happened within Tooele City and you would rather file your police report online instead of meeting with an officer, go to the Tooele City Police website tooelecity gov/police and

click on the "File a Police Report" link under the Quick Links Menu. Read the instructions fully to make sure your case is eligible for online reporting.

Online reporting is <u>not</u> for: Reporting emergencies, crimes in progress, violent crimes, or if you need to speak with an officer quickly. For emergencies, please dial 911, if you need to speak with an officer and it is not an emergency, please call Dispatch at 435-882-5600, option #1. If you have questions about the online reporting system you can contact the Police Dept. at 435-882-8900 Monday through Friday 8 am to 5 pm. ONLINE

Here is a list of crimes that are eligible to be filed online: Credit Card Fraud, Identity Theft, Fraud/ Scam, Lost Property, Found Property, Retail Theft, Telephone Harassment, Vehicle Burglary, Illegal Dumping, Graffiti, Vandalism, Property Damage, Hit and Run (no known suspect), Vehicle Accident (if damage is less than \$2500), Mail/Package Theft, Theft of Services, Theft.

Upon completion of the online reporting process, you will be given a police report case number and you will be able to print a copy of the police report to keep for your records.

For those who have not paid their Commercial Business License Renewal Fee, a 50% late fee will be implemented on February 1, 2024. You will have until March 15, 2024, to pay the licensing fee + the penalty fee. If we have not heard from you, your license will be considered inactive and we will close your business after March 15, 2024. You can mail in your payment, bring your payment in person to the Finance Department at City Hall, leave your payment in the Utility Payment Drop Box on the south side of City Hall, or renew your license and make a payment online at https://www.municipalonlinepayments.com/tooeleut. Please include the business license number that is on your business license certificate in the upper left-hand corner under the Tooele City logo. If you are no longer in business, please let us know in writing by e-mailing businesslicense@tooelecity.gov.
