Summer is here! Tooele City has many summer activities planned this year, including the Tooele City Arts Council’s Fridays on Vine Summer Concerts (starting June 7 at the Aquatic Center Park) and the many Tooele City 4th of July activities. Check tooelecity.gov to see the different events. Hopefully you will be able to join us at one of these fun events.

Summer is a great time to get outdoors and explore the community. Stop by one of the buffalo statues sponsored by our local businesses, check out the Tooele Valley Museum, play some golf, shop downtown, host a block party (with pizza provided by Tooele City), visit a park, play some pickleball, or walk the England Acres Trail.

The Tooele City Council recently approved a new Active Transportation Plan. This plan will help us be forward thinking in transportation infrastructure, make well-informed decisions regarding active transportation, and be a guide for funding allocation prioritization and building roadways that are conducive to different modes of transportation. It also helps us coordinate with the Tooele County trail map and the City and County Transportation Plans. We want well connected sidewalks, safe routes across or around high volume, high speed roads that bisect neighborhoods, and safe access for those who travel by something other than a car. The England Acres Trail is the newest part of our trail network – go take a walk and check it out. The construction on Droubay Road will widen and improve the road. After the completion of the road, a separated trail will be added on the side of the road.

Our community has a lot to offer! I hope you will take advantage of not only the City sponsored activities, but also the events that are hosted by our local businesses and community partners. Supporting local events and businesses helps strengthen our City and builds a sense of community.

NOTICE—WATER AND SEWER FEE INCREASE

Tooele City will be implementing newly adopted fees for water and sewer services as approved by City Ordinance on April 3, 2024, beginning with the bill you will receive June 1, 2024. The increases follow a thorough external rate study, which highlighted the necessity of these fee adjustments. Increased costs and needed critical infrastructure improvements to our public utility systems make these fee adjustments necessary in order to ensure the continued efficiency and reliability of these systems. Droubay Road Closure

Construction began in May 2024 on the Droubay Road Widening Project. Droubay Road will be widened between Vine Street and Smelter Road. Improvements will include road widening, curb, gutter, sidewalk, lighting, and a walking/biking path. In order to complete this project safely and in a timely manner, Droubay Road will be completely closed between Vine Street and Smelter Road for the duration of the project (we anticipate this project will be complete by the end of the Summer/early Fall). Recognizing Suspicious Activity

The first rule of crime prevention is to always be alert. Anything that seems slightly out of place or occurs at an unusual time of day could be criminal activity.

- Never attempt to apprehend a suspect or investigate a possible crime on your own. Call the police immediately. Do not worry about being embarrassed if your suspicions prove to be unfounded; law enforcement officers would rather investigate than be called when it is too late.
- Time and accuracy are critical when reporting crime and suspicious events. Call 9-1-1 when reporting life threatening events or crimes in progress, and call 435-882-5600 ext. 1 when reporting delayed events or crimes.

2024 Watering Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Please do not water outdoors on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at (435) 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

NUISANCE WEEDS:

Per Tooele City Code Section 8-4-4 1(a), any weeds/grass on real property under 5 acres must be cut and maintained under 6 inches. Property owners are responsible for park strip area(s) adjacent to their lot. Any lot larger than 5 acres must have a border of 30 feet cut and maintained under 6 inches. Fines may be assessed for properties not in compliance with City Code! The full text of the above referenced City Code can be found on our website tooelecit.gov. Fireworks Restrictions 2024
