MAYOR'S MESSAGE

On Wednesday, February 7, 2024, I presented the 2024 State of the City Address. I spoke about the great things that we have done and are doing in the City, progress the City has made, projects that are happening, and the challenges we face. As part of the address, I am excited to announce a new City slogan:

"Tooele City - A Hometown to be Proud of!"

I am proud of our hometown. I am proud to be a resident of Tooele City and I am grateful to serve as Mayor.

During the address I also recognized several individuals and groups:

— Tooele City Police Department, "I am extremely grateful and proud of the men and women who serve as Tooele City Police officers. They are well trained men and women who put their lives on the line each time they begin their shift. They respond to extremely difficult situations every day to protect the lives and safety of our citizens."

— Three individual officers who were recognized include Sergeant Chris Thompson, Officer Mike Madrid, and Officer Andrew Wood who rescued a 12-year-old girl who was trapped in a sinking car in the Settlement Canyon reservoir in June of 2023.

— Tooele City Fire Department, "Thank you to the men and women who serve unselfishly while risking their own lives in the service of their fellow man."

— Two firefighters who were recognized individually include John Curwen and Ron Baum who are the two longest serving, active firefighters. They each have over 40 years of active service to our department and our community.

— I also thanked all the volunteers and veterans in our community for their service to our community and our country, and recognized Fred Barker who is a veteran of the US Army. "Fred has walked in nearly every Tooele City 4th of July parade that I can remember. He also participates in nearly every military honor guard ceremony held at the Tooele City Cemetery. He displays his military collection at the annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day ceremonies."

— I also thanked the employees of Tooele City for their hard work and dedication, "The City could not provide the services to our residents if it were not for our exceptional employees."

THE COUNCIL’S CORNER

Tooele City Mayor Debbie Winn and the Tooele City Council had the privilege of honoring Becky Bracken with the Tooele City Community Recognition Award at the Tooele County Chamber of Commerce’s Annual Installation and Awards Banquet on Friday, February 2, 2024, for her service as the volunteer coordinator of the Tooele County Youth Court.

In 2018, Becky was invited to attend a meeting to advise a group on how to reestablish a Youth Court in our community because she had had prior experience running a Youth Court. At the time she accepted the invitation “to advise,” she did not realize that she would be asked at that meeting to reestablish and run youth court, which she also accepted.

Becky certified the Tooele County Youth Court with the Youth Court State Advisory Board in 2018. Tooele City is happy to now be the official sponsoring entity of Tooele County Youth Court.

Youth Court is a volunteer program in which youth are trained as attorneys (defense and prosecution), judges, and bailiffs. The premise of youth court is to give juveniles a second chance; it is a diversion court certified by the State of Utah. They take referrals from law enforcement, juvenile court, parents, and schools for youth charged with Class B misdemeanors or less offenses. Defendants go through the court process. They and their parents are interviewed, they must admit guilt, and then they are given a sentence—usually community service hours, writing an essay on what they learned, or writing apology letters. Youth Court offers a way for youth to learn from their mistakes and be held accountable without having to go through the juvenile court system and have a juvenile record.

Thank you to all of the adult and youth volunteers who make this program possible, but none of it would be possible without Becky.

Becky is at every single session of Youth Court, every Thursday night. She also accompanies youth on their service projects, their trainings, and their conventions. All of this is on her own time. She is not paid for any of the time or service she gives. She is a great mentor for both the youth that serve in youth court and the youth and their families who use youth court’s services.

Becky previously served our community for over 20 years as a Tooele City Police Officer.

We want to recognize Becky for her service, for her dedication to this program, for the countless hours that she unselfishly gives to our community, and especially for the impact she is having on the youth of our community. She truly is changing lives for the better. She is empowering the youth and helping them become our leaders of tomorrow. Thank you Becky!

MARCH IS FLOOD AWARENESS MONTH

The potential for flooding could occur at any time. Sometimes, floods develop slowly and forecasters can anticipate where a flood will happen days or weeks before it occurs. Oftentimes, flash floods can occur within minutes and sometimes without any sign of rain. Being prepared can save your life and give you peace of mind. Here are some suggestions from the National Weather Service (<https://www.weather.gov/safety/flood-before>) to make sure you and your family and home are prepared:

CREATE A COMMUNICATIONS PLAN: It is important to be able to communicate with your family and friends in the event of a disaster. Whether it is having a specific person identified to contact for status updates or a safe location to meet up with family members, having a plan in place will give you peace of mind if disaster does strike.

ASSEMBLE AN EMERGENCY KIT: It is good practice to have enough food, water, and medicine on hand at all times to last you at least 3 days in the case of an emergency. Water service may be interrupted or unsafe to drink and food requiring little cooking and no refrigeration may be needed if electric power is interrupted. You should also have batteries, blankets, flashlights, first aid kits, rubber boots, rubber gloves, and a NOAA Weather Radio or other battery operated radios easily available.

KNOW YOUR RISK: Is your home, business or school in a floodplain? Where is water likely to collect on the roadways you most often travel? What is the fastest way to get to higher ground? Knowing the answers to these questions ahead of time can save your life.

SIGN UP FOR NOTIFICATIONS: Sign up for TooeleAlerts to receive emergency alerts and notifications. See information below.

PREPARE YOUR HOME:

1. If you have access to sandbags or other materials, use them to protect your home from flood waters if you have sufficient time to do so. Filling sandbags can take more time than you may think.
2. Have a professional install check-valves in plumbing to prevent flood waters from backing up into the drains of your home. Make sure your sump pump is working and consider having a backup. Make sure your electric circuit breakers, or fuses, are clearly marked for each area of your home.
3. Since standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding, ensure coverage by contacting your insurance company or agent to purchase flood insurance. This must be done before there is even a threat of flooding as insurance companies stop issuing policies if there is a threat of flooding (i.e. an approaching hurricane). Many flood insurance policies take at least 30 days to go into effect so even if you can buy it as a storm is approaching, it may not protect your investment.

PREPARE YOUR FAMILY/PETS: You may be evacuated, so pack in advance. Don't wait until the last moment to gather the essentials for yourself, your family, and/or your pets.

CHARGE YOUR ESSENTIAL ELECTRONICS: Make sure your cell phone and portable radios are all charged in case you lose power or need to evacuate. Also make sure you have back-up batteries on hand.

LEAVE: If it is likely your home will flood, don't wait to be ordered to leave; evacuate yourself! Make alternative plans for a place to stay. If you have pets, take them with you or make arrangements to board them at a facility well away from the flooding danger.

TOOELE **ALERT**

Tooele County is able to send you emergency alerts via text message, email, pager, or voice mail (in extreme cases), based on your preferences. It is important that we collect this contact information because many households no longer utilize traditional land-based telephone lines. Sign up at tcem.org today!

- NOTICE - GARBAGE CAN FEE INCREASE

Attention Tooele City Customers:

Effective February 1, 2024, Tooele City implemented the newly adopted fees for garbage can service of \$13/month for a first can, and \$6.50/month for any additional cans. After a comprehensive external study of the garbage removal and disposal costs it has been determined this fee increase is necessary in order to keep up with increased costs of the monthly garbage service provided to residents. This rate is reflected on the bill dated February 26, 2024.

Customers who need to have any additional cans picked up may do so by emailing a request to utilities@tooelecity.gov, by calling 435-843-2150, or visiting our office at 90 N. Main St., Tooele. The first can fee is a required service for all residential utility customers.

TRASH/DEBRIS ITEMS:

Any garbage/debris/unsightly objects must be properly disposed of within a timely manner. Section 8-4-4 1(b) and (e) of Tooele City code states these will be deemed a nuisance: (b) the accumulation of garbage, refuse, or unsightly or deleterious objects or structures upon real property, unless contained in connection with an association lawfully situated and licensed for the same; (e) any other unsightly or deleterious condition that gives rise to a threat to human health or safety;

INOPERABLE/ABANDONED VEHICLES:

Only two inoperable motor vehicles may be kept and must be placed behind a screened fence, or in an enclosed building. Vehicle coverings are not considered in compliance with this code. Section 8-4-4 1(c) and (d) of Tooele City code states such vehicles will be deemed a nuisance: (a) junked, wrecked, or inoperable motor vehicles upon real property, for longer than 72 hours, except that up to 2 such vehicles or parts thereof may be stored within an enclosed building or completely screened by a sight-obscuring fence. (d) Abandoned motor vehicles.
