RESOLUTION 2022-11

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOOELE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING MAYOR WINN TO SIGN GRANT APPLICATIONS FOR 1000 NORTH WEST INDUSTRIAL COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT PROJECT AREA INFRASTRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2017, the Redevelopment Agency of Tooele City, Utah, (“RDA”) approved RDA Resolution 2017-09 to adopt a Project Area Plan for the 1000 North West Industrial Community Reinvestment Project Area (“Project Area”) in order to facilitate economic development in Tooele City; and,

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2017, the Tooele City Council approved Ordinance 2017-30 to adopt the same Project Area Plan for the same purpose; and,

WHEREAS, RDA Resolution 2017-09, including the Project Area Plan and the Project Area maps, is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the term “economic development” is defined by the State of Utah to include the following purposes: (a) creating, developing, attracting, and retaining business; (b) creating or preserving jobs; (c) stimulating business and economic activity; and, (d) providing allowable local incentives (see UCA 17C-1-1001(4)); and,

WHEREAS, the economic development purposes stated in RDA Resolution 2017-09 included the following: (e) providing essential governmental services to the Project Area by providing a mechanism to develop public infrastructure within or to serve the Project Area; (f) encouraging and accomplishing appropriate private development and community development activities within the Project Area; and, (g) providing for the strengthening of the tax base and economic health of the community (see RDA Resolution 2017-09 Section 3); and,

WHEREAS, Collapsible Revolution LLC proposes to construct a manufacturing facility (“Facility”) on a five-acre parcel located at approximately 2000 North 1885 West in Tooele City (“Property”), within the Project Area; and,

WHEREAS, Collapsible Revolution has developed global freight industry technologies, consisting of two main elements: 1) a collapsible shipping container called GenFlat which allows for the efficient storage and transportation of empty containers by collapsing them so that four containers can be stored and shipped in the space of one traditional, non-collapsible container; and, 2) a machine known as an Actuator which will both collapse and expand the GenFlat containers. These technologies are aimed at mitigating the logistical and supply chain problems facing the transport and manufacturing industries; and,

WHEREAS, the Facility on the Property will further the economic development purposes of the RDA, the Project Area, and UCA Title 17C; and,

WHEREAS, for the Facility to function on the Property, it will be necessary to install a variety of public and private utilities, at significant Collapsible Revolution expense, including roads, water and sewer lines, and power, gas, and communication lines (collectively "Infrastructure"), which Infrastructure currently does not exist on or to the Property; and,

WHEREAS, Collapsible Revolution has requested the support of Tooele City, as an Eligible Project Sponsor, to apply for federal, state, and private grants to fund all or a portion of the Infrastructure capital expenses; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to written agreement, Collapsible Revolution will research grant opportunities, prepare grant material, and pay any required matching funds associated with approved grant funding for the Infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to written agreement, Collapsible Revolution will provide sufficient indemnifications and releases to protect Tooele City interests; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to written agreement, Collapsible Revolution will be responsible for all costs associated with the preparation of grant applications, Infrastructure planning, design, and construction, grant reporting, and otherwise, associated with the Infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, Infrastructure to the Property has the potential to further the economic development purposes in the remainder of the Project Area, as well as in Tooele City at large, and thus is in the best interest of Tooele City; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOOELE CITY COUNCIL that:

1. Mayor Winn is hereby authorized to sign on behalf of Tooele City, as an Eligible Project Sponsor, grant application and other documents associated with funding the Infrastructure in the Project Area, consistent with this Resolution; and,
2. Mayor Winn is hereby authorized to collaborate in the preparation of the written agreement referenced above; and,
3. Tooele City hereby retains full discretion as to the Infrastructure to be designed and constructed, as to the grant applications to be submitted, and otherwise.

This Resolution shall become effective upon passage, without further publication, by authority of the Tooele City Charter.

ORDINANCE 2022-05

AN ORDINANCE OF TOOELE CITY AMENDING TOOELE CITY CODE SECTION 3-3-2 REGARDING INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE ENFORCEMENT.

WHEREAS, Utah Constitution, Article XI, Section 5 directly confers upon Utah's charter cities, including Tooele City, "the authority to exercise all powers relating to municipal affairs, and to adopt and enforce within its limits, local police, sanitary and similar regulations not in conflict with the general law"; and,

WHEREAS, Utah Code Section 10-8-84 enables Tooele City to "pass all ordinances and rules, and make all regulations . . . as are necessary and proper to provide for the safety and preserve the health, and promote the prosperity, improve the morals, peace and good order, comfort, and convenience of the city and its inhabitants, and for the protection of property in the city"; and,

WHEREAS, by authority of Tooele City Charter Section 2-06, the Fire Department is a Tooele City administrative department, the operations of which are supervised by the Mayor (see Charter Section 2-06 and Tooele City Code Section 1-6-4); and,

WHEREAS, Tooele City has adopted the International Fire Code by way of Tooele City Code Section 3-3-1; and,

WHEREAS, Tooele City Code Section 3-3-2 governs enforcement of the International Fire Code and the selection and removal of fire inspectors; and,

WHEREAS, the Tooele City Policies and Procedures Manual, adopted by ordinance by the City Council, governs the selection and removal of all City employees and volunteers; and,

WHEREAS, the City Administration recommends amending Section 3-3-2 to indicate that the International Fire Code is enforced by the Fire Department in coordination with the Community Development Department, inasmuch as the latter has general authority for building code enforcement, building plans review, building permits, and building inspections under the uniform International Code Council (ICC) codes, including the Building Code, Residential Code, Plumbing Code, Electrical Code, Energy Code, Fire Code, and other uniform international codes, adopted by Tooele City until Tooele City Code Titles 3 and 4 (see the proposed amendment, shown in Exhibit A); and,

WHEREAS, the City Administration recommends that Section 3-3-2 be amended consistent with the Tooele City Policies and Procedures Manual regarding employee and volunteer selection and removal (see Exhibit A); and,

WHEREAS, this Ordinance and its proposed City Code amendments are consistent with the respective legislative and administrative authorities defined by the City Charter and City Code, and are in the best interest of Tooele City:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY TOOELE CITY that Tooele City Code Section 3-3-2 is hereby amended, as shown in Exhibit A.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage, without further publication, by authority of the Tooele City Charter.

3-3-1. **International Fire Code.**

Tooele City recognizes that the State of Utah has adopted the International Fire Code, as amended and/or revised, as law governing the State of Utah and all political subdivisions thereof. To the extent that Tooele City is not preempted by the law of the State of Utah from adopting the International Fire Code as an ordinance of Tooele City, its most current edition is so adopted, including its Appendices B, C, and D. (Ord. 2005-14, 06-15-2005); (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 98-04, 01-21-98); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-2. **Enforcement.**

~~(1) The "International Fire Code" and the "International Fire Code Standards" shall be enforced by the bureau of fire prevention in the Tooele City fire department in coordination with the Community Development Department.~~

~~(2) The chief of the fire department shall recommend to the mayor the employment of technical inspectors, who, when such authorization is made, shall be selected through an examination to determine their fitness for the position. The examination shall be open to members and nonmembers of the fire department, and appointments made after examination shall be for an indefinite term with removal only for cause.~~ (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-3. **Definitions.**

As used in the "International Fire Code":

- (1) "Jurisdiction" means Tooele City.
- (2) "Chief of the bureau of fire prevention" means the fire chief. (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04,

3-3-4. **Conflict.**

The provisions of the "International Fire Code" shall be read and interpreted whenever possible so as to comply with the provisions of the zoning, building, and other ordinances of Tooele City. If a conflict between the "International Fire Code" and another ordinance arises, the conflicting provisions shall be interpreted to first provide for the greatest safety of the property and citizens of the community, and second to provide as nearly as possible for the accomplishment of the intent of the "International Fire Code." (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-5. **Amendments made in the "International Fire Code."**

Applications for permits made under Section 105 of the "International Fire Code" shall be made to the Tooele City Engineering Department. (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-6. **Establishment of limits of districts in which storage of flammable or combustible liquids in outside aboveground tanks is prohibited.**

The limits referred to in Section 7902 of the "International Fire Code" in which the storage of flammable or combustible liquids is restricted are hereby established as follows: in M-D and M-G zoning districts by permitted use, and in C-G zoning districts by conditional use only. (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-7. **Establishment of limits in which storage of liquefied petroleum gases is to be restricted.**

The limits referred to in Sections 8204 and 8212 in which the storage of liquefied petroleum gas is restricted are hereby established as follows: in M-D and M-G zoning districts by permitted use, and in C-G zoning districts by conditional use only. (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-8. **Establishment of limits of districts in which storage of explosive materials is to be prohibited.**

The limits referred to in Section 7702 of the "International Fire Code" in which storage of explosive materials is prohibited are hereby established as follows: in M-D, M-G, and C-G zoning districts by conditional use only. (Ord. 2004-15, 10-20-04); (Ord. 95-04, 05-19-95)

3-3-9. **Flammable and combustible liquids.**
