Has this been an unusual spring or what!?! I can't ever remember one like it. I'm very grateful the weather has moderated as it has, allowing the snow pack to melt slowly. What runoff there is, is being managed within our drainage ditches and to this point has caused no problems. I would ask parents and caregivers to please be aware of where your children are-with the water running, there is an ever present temptation to play in or around it.

The budget for fiscal year 2011-2012 was adopted by the City Council on June 15th. Again this year, NO TAX INCREASE! We're continuing to live within our means. We will continue to

provide quality public service. We are very sound financially and will continue to manage your money conservatively this year. I appreciate the employees for the great job they do. I thank the members of the City Council for their leadership and involvement, they are great partners.

I apologize in advance for some inconvenience this summer as we continue our road and water maintenance projects. We will be doing approximately \$1.4 million in road repair, \$1 million of water line upgrades, and drilling 2 new water wells with this year's budget. Phase 2 of the wastewater treatment plant expansion project will begin, well as our Skyline Park project. We have a lot to done;

Water Conservation Schedule

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

The City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

If there are special circumstances that require a modified schedule for residents or businesses—such as newly planted sod or lawn, contact Tooele City at 843-2150.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and schools may be watering more than two days each week, each specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Thank you for your help in conserving water, a precious resource.

This fall, Tooele City will hold an election to elect three city council members for four-year terms. To qualify for office, you must be: (1) a United States citizen; (2) at least 18 years old; (3) a resident of Tooele City for at least one year immediately preceding the date of the election; and (4) a registered voter.

If there are a sufficient number of candidates, Tooele City will hold a primary election on September 13th. The general election will be

November 8, 2011.

If you are interested in running for city council, visit the Tooele City Recorder's Office at 90 N. Main St. You will need to file a Declaration of Candidacy and pay a filing fee of \$30.

The filing period runs from July 1, 2011 to July 15, 2011 during regular business hours

(Monday- Friday, 8 am to 5 pm).




