WATER CONSERVATION SCHEDULE

Area #1 All water users North of Vine and West of Main water Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Area #2 All water users North of Vine and East of Main water Tuesdays and Fridays.

Area #3 All water users South of Vine water Mondays and Thursdays.

Outdoor watering is not permitted on Sundays.

City encourages residents not to water during the hottest hours of the day, typically between 10 am and 6 pm. This conserves water and reduces your water bills.

City parks and schools have been placed on a modified schedule because of the size of their lawn areas. While some parks and school may be watering more than two days each week, a specific area of that park is only watered twice during the week.

Master Gardener curriculum.




